Presidents Message

The West Virginia Education Fund is completing its seventh year and as we look back, a review of the Fund's record of achievement is indeed enlightening. It is a well-documented fact that your Education Fund has, and is continuing to, fulfill its goal of improving the quality and education process of our public school children in the State of West Virginia.

The class of 2000 started the third grade this year. This class has so many more opportunities available to succeed as well as so many additional obstacles to overcome than most of us adults ever thought of or faced at their age. When we were in school, the everyday problems were talking in class, chewing gum, passing notes, and missing the waste basket. The fact that approximately 40 percent dropped out of school and did not graduate at that time was not considered terrible. Now, look at the problems facing our students in today's schools. They include, but are not limited to, drug and alcohol abuse, suicide, teenage pregnancy, and carrying lethal weapons. Our dropout rate, which has been reduced to about 20 percent, is now considered far too high. From the reports we read and the forecasts which have been prepared, we just do not have enough third graders to fill the needs and demands of our expanding economy and labor force in the year 2000. The fact is we cannot afford to lose any of these students. The jobs necessary to our future society will require a good education, technical skills, creativity, and problem-solving abilities. The demands on our education system are greater than ever and require involvement from all of us.

EDUCATION has become a buzz word throughout our nation and throughout West Virginia. In my opinion there is a true commitment within West Virginia as never before to bring about improvements in our educational process. Goals for the year 2000 are being identified and established. These goals are comprehensive in nature and are being targeted to prepare each and every young West Virginian to enjoy the opportunity for a productive meaningful life. We are on the leading edge and are coming to a point of focus which has the potential of placing West Virginia in the

forefront and as a possible model for others to follow. Instead of a state identified as a lagger in education, West Virginians are standing up and being counted in their cause to invest in education and in our children so as to ensure our and their future. The commitment is loud and clear that our children are the true future of our state and country.

Your Education Fund stands on the "cutting edge" and is a leader in this new commitment to make education first and to improve the education process in West Virginia. Since it was established in 1983, the West Virginia Education Fund can be credited for the excellent and meaningful progress it has made in developing a much greater level of community interest in education on the state as well as a county-wide basis. It is indeed gratifying that the various programs of the West Virginia Education Fund have been so enthusiastically embraced by both the school and business communities throughout the state.

I am pleased to report the Education Fund, which is supported solely through private funding from businesses, individuals, and foundations, is actively developing and reviewing several new programs to be introduced when additional funding is available. In the meanwhile, your Education Fund remains committed and will continue with current programs including Minigrants, Partnerships in Education, Parental Involvement Awards, College Bound, Think College, and A Day on Campus. These programs and other activities, such as the recently prepared Directory of Private Sector Scholarships available to students in West Virginia, continue to raise the morale of teachers, encourage excellence and innovation, reduce the isolation of schools from the communities they serve, and help to create a broad new support base for public school education among West Virginia's citizens.

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as President of the West Virginia Education Fund during the past year. We have continued to grow and make good progress in our programs, and we have started to set in place a statewide fund raising organization to insure the long-term continuation of the Fund. I would



like to thank and recognize the continued dedication and commitment on the part of our Trustees, officers, outstanding staff, and our innovative Director, Vivian Kidd. The teamwork and cooperation by this outstanding group is reflected in the success of the Fund itself and the "difference" being made to improve the education process within our state. Our continued appreciation and recognition is also extended to the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation and to Mr. Paul Jenkins, its President, who so generously and promptly assisted the Fund during a critical cash shortage this year. A special thank you is also extended to the Consolidated Natural Gas Foundation, Ashland Oil Foundation, C&P Telephone Company of West Virginia, and Union Carbide Corporation for their continued generous support to the Fund, and to other contributors listed in this report.

There is much yet to do and we must continue to focus our efforts to achieve a clear and shared vision of what our education system should be and what it should achieve. To this end, we urge and encourage all West Virginians to unite in the common cause of making "Education and our Children" first in our state.

Introduction

Long-term economic development and growth for West Virginia depends, in large measure, on first-class education for all students. Quality education pays substantial dividends through employability, increased production, and the personal satisfaction of individuals.

As the task of educating youth becomes more difficult and complex, educators face frustration, inadequate funds, and a weakening of the fabric of public education. The West Virginia Education Fund is a response to that frustration and a way of reweaving that fabric. Started in 1983, it is a statewide private nonprofit organization designed to bring the resources and expertise of the private sector together with the knowledge and creativity of the school system. It recognizes and encourages excellence and creativity in teaching and promotes a better understanding of the preparation students need for success in a rapidly changing world. The Education Fund helps to assure public collaboration to leaven the quality of public education in our state.

The organization is supported by donations from individuals, organizations, businesses, cor-

porations, and foundations. Gifts are tax deductible and greatly appreciated.

This year, the Education Fund launched its first statewide financial development effort to support its activities. Supported by a special grant for this purpose from the Benedum Foundation, the organization added the position of development director to the staff. This person is charged with developing the volunteer structure and providing the staff support to the volunteers to achieve a goal of \$400,000 through a broad-based effort throughout the state. A volunteer task force to plan this initiative and to develop the materials and marketing strategy necessary is chaired by Russ Lorince of Monongahela Power Company. Members of the task force include Melissa Morris of Consolidated Natural Gas Corporation, Stan Burnett of Hope Gas, Sue McKain of Acme Fishing Tools, D. E. Cochran of Ames Lawn & Garden Tools, Virgil Cook of the State Board of Education, David Schuchts of Ames Lawn & Garden Tools, Roy Terek of C & P Telephone Company, and Steve Woomer of Simpson & Osborne.

MISSION:

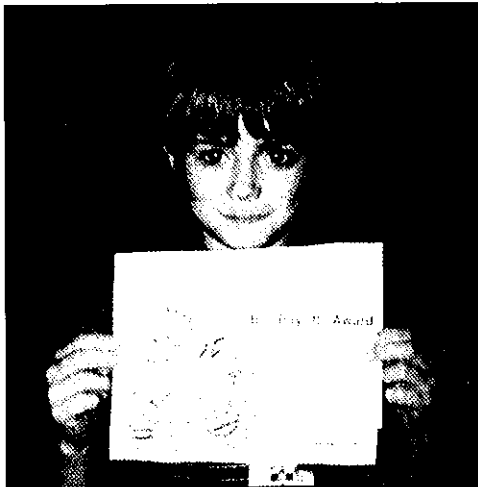
The mission of the West Virginia Education Fund is to advance the quality of public education (through grade 12) in West Virginia by:

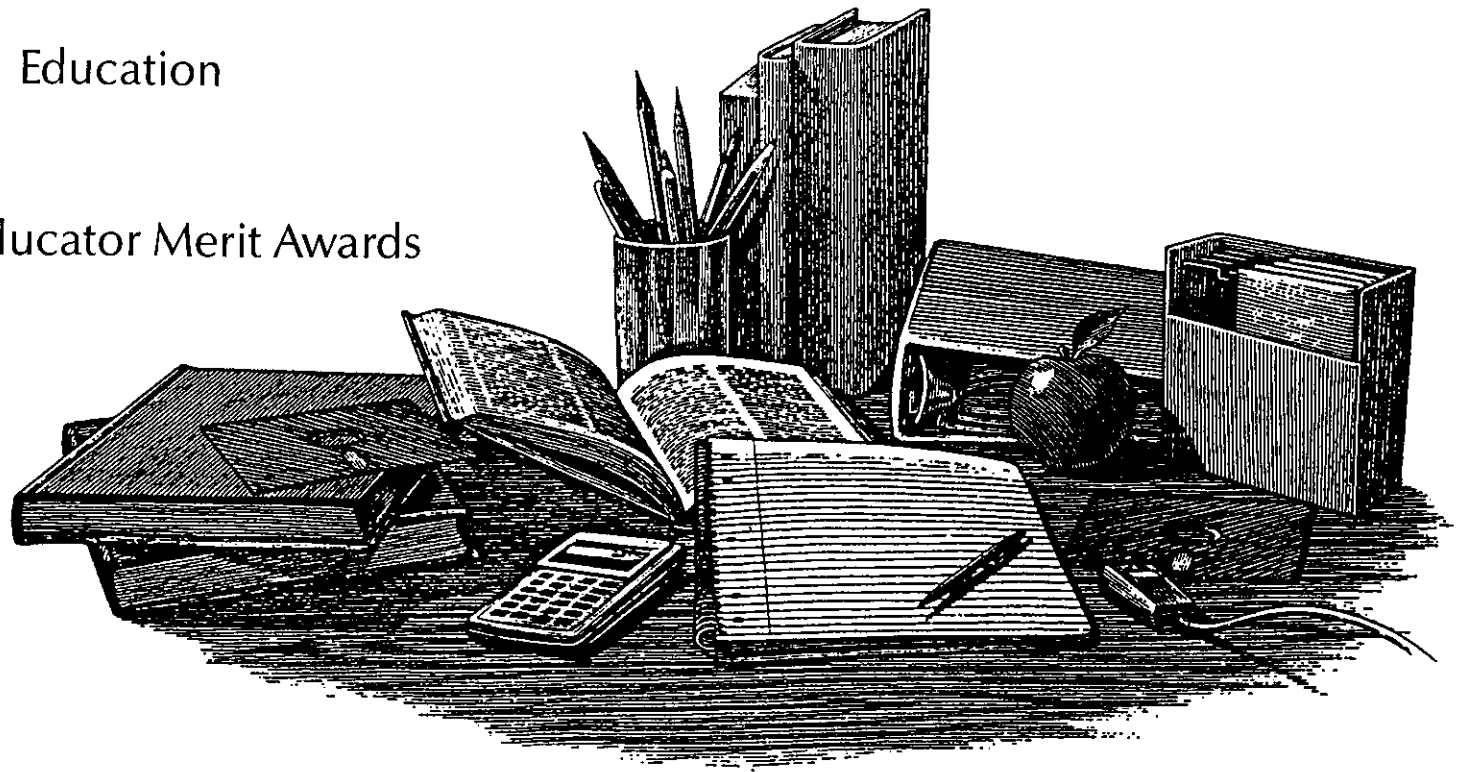

Minigrants for Classroom Projects

Minigrants for Classroom Projects are small cash awards offered to public school teachers on a competitive basis to support innovative projects for which no public funds are available. Since the program began in 1983, the Education Fund has awarded more than \$322,000 to teachers for over 1,300 projects that enhance the learning experiences of West Virginia's students.

Projects have addressed practically every subject at almost every age level, including such areas as geological digs and expeditions, writing books and local histories, entrepreneurial ventures, experiments in nutrition, science and environmental studies, a student-run radio station, and multicultural festivals.

Teachers are invited to submit proposals for these funds. Regional volunteer committees review the proposals and determine which should be funded and to what levels. Members are often able to direct educators to additional community resources, thus expanding the value of the Minigrants program. The process also helps volunteer members who are not part of the education system to gain a better understanding of the needs of educators and the issues they face. Competitive grants opportunities often stimulate hard thinking about education issues, and they promote cooperative and innovative solutions.

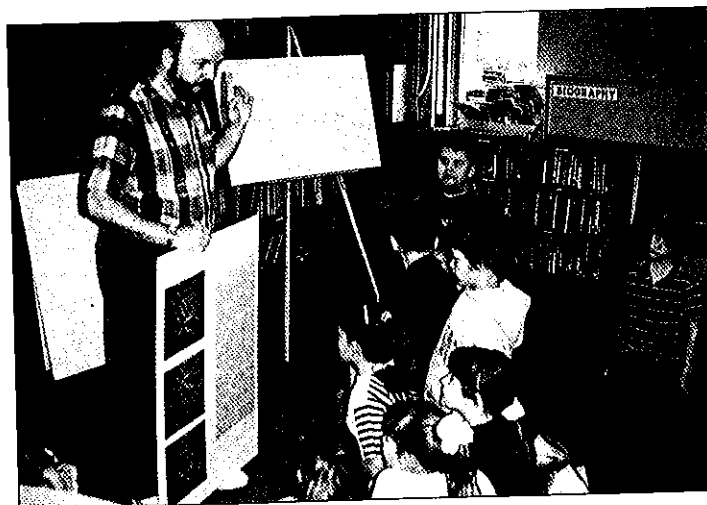

These grants, sponsored by Union Carbide Corporation, may be up to \$1,000 each, and often support projects that involve parents as co-learners with their children.

Parental involvement is a proven method of increasing student achievement, and it is a sure way of enhancing parental support in the governance and advocacy of education. Numerous national reports have stated that support to enhance parental involvement is the most cost-effective strategy available to policy makers seeking to improve schools. Yet, many people still think of bake sales and field trip chaperones when thinking of the involvement of parents.

The Parental Involvement Awards are intended to encourage the support of learning activities at home, volunteering in the school building in the academic experiences of the children, and becoming involved in governance and advocacy.

Partnerships In Education

"A handshake, not a handout" is an accurate description of the Partnerships in Education Program. Focusing on obtaining human resources rather than financial support for the public schools, the program links individual schools with individual businesses or community organizations in cooperative, mutually beneficial relationships. These relationships promote cooperation between the public and private sectors in the pursuit of excellence in public education in West Virginia, and allow improvement to happen in a concrete and manageable way.

The Education Fund started Partnerships in Education in West Virginia in 1984. The bond that develops between schools and businesses is not built upon financial support, but rather through the sharing of human resources and common goals. The glue that holds the relationships together is a common concern for the quality of the academic experiences of the students in the classroom, and the understanding that these collaborative efforts produce tangible benefits for the school, the businesses, the students, and the community.

The objectives of the program are:

- To bring business people into the schools to work with the students, teachers, and administrators on projects which school people think will be helpful and business people feel qualified to accomplish;
- To give students and teachers a realistic picture of the business world and of the preparation students need for success;
- To supplement classroom studies with relevant learning experiences in business and industry; and,
- To give business people an understanding of the education system, how it works, its strengths, and its problems.

Since its inception, the Partnerships in Education Program has served as a vehicle for various community segments to come together comfort-



ably in a climate of mutual trust and respect to work for improved education for public school students. Principals and superintendents have reported substantial positive changes in the learning environments of their schools that they attribute to their business partners.

The existence of over 650 Partnerships in Education in 53 of the 55 counties in our state attests to the extent to which businesses, schools and communities have embraced the program. The success of the program can be attributed, in large measure, to the sincere dedication and support of county superintendents, educators, parents, business people, and community members who clearly care about the education of our children.

AMONG THE BENEFITS

One of the most obvious benefits a school can gain from a partnership with a business is the direct contact it allows between staff and students and the outside world. Providing contact with people from business not only helps reduce the school's isolation, but also gives students a view of the business world, its op-

portunities, and its expectations, a perspective they are not as likely to find within the pages of a textbook or the four walls of a classroom.

Contact with the outside world can be as beneficial to the employees of a business as it is for educators and students. As more businesses recognize the link between public education and the economic vitality of their communities, they realize that any assistance they lend today is a wise investment toward ensuring a capable work force for tomorrow.

The following partnerships activities are just a small sample of the successes of the program in West Virginia.

For one Wood County school, learning the aspects of operating a radio station has proven to be an exciting and challenging experience. Members of the radio station staff each spend a week at the school describing their jobs and explaining how they affect the operation of a station. Students are then asked to produce work related to the various jobs, such as writing commercials, planning promotional events, studying market indicators to predict which records will succeed, and doing programming for broadcast.

A radio station in Roane County produced public service announcements written by the

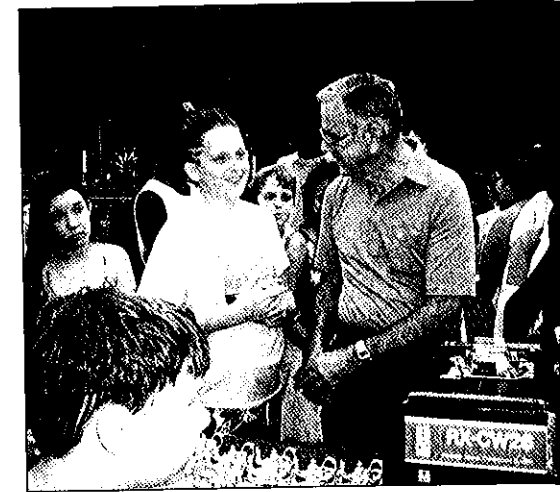
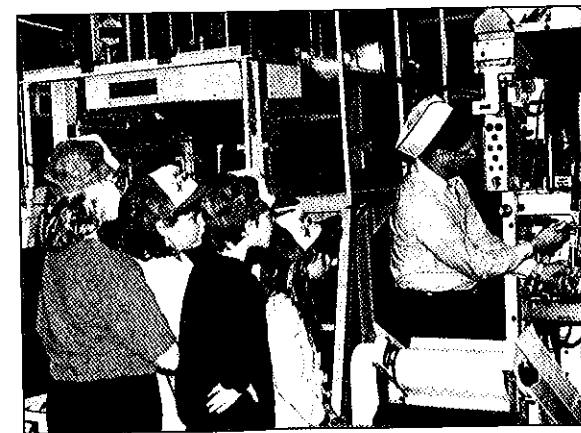
students on environmental issues. The announcements were distributed to stations in other counties, and one announcement, entitled "America the Beautiful—A Message to Governor Caperton," received a formal compliment from the Governor.

A Greenbrier County community hospital and its partner school conduct a mini-health clinic. Hospital employees check students' weight, blood pressure, scoliosis, and cholesterol, and discuss the desired levels and how to achieve them. Students learn more by interviewing physicians, nurses, the hospital administrator, engineers, and lab technicians. Students then share their knowledge about how to have a healthy body by producing public service announcements.

Students at a Cabell County school are under the close watch of the "Roving Tiger Eye." The school's partner provides support for the project that recognizes students for qualities such as good behavior, responsibility, helpfulness, friendliness, cooperation, and participation. Students exhibiting one of these positive characteristics are recognized and rewarded.

A number of companies are utilizing their resources to provide video tapes, classroom speakers, and literature for their school partners on subjects such as drug abuse, careers, and safety, among others. Students are actively involved in these issues through writing essays, performing skits and plays, and sponsoring community events. In addition to providing classroom speakers and tours of businesses for students, business partners are illustrating how to complete job applications, providing mock job interviews and sponsoring "Shadow Days." These events allow students to accompany employees on jobs in which students have an interest.

Mentorships are becoming popular and effective activities among partners. Representatives of business and community partners are working with "at-risk" students to assist them through help with class projects, discuss problems, share mutual hobbies, and encourage students to finish high school and to continue education beyond high school. These volunteers are serving as role models and providing a positive influence for children who may have little other encouragement outside the school.



Activities listed here are just a small sample of the hundreds of partnerships projects that have benefitted thousands of students in West Virginia. The Education Fund publishes a quarterly newsletter to share the exciting and rewarding activities occurring among school-business partnerships.

Resource Partners are developing in some areas of the sixteen counties of the state which have all schools in the county linked with a business or other community partner. Starting in Wood County and spreading to other areas, Resource Partners provide a way for small businesses or other community groups to become involved with local schools on an as-needed basis. Typically, a directory is published and distributed to the schools which lists what resources are available and how to contact the appropriate parties. It is important to note that this activity is successful only where there are already active partners for all schools in the county.

College Bound

In September 1987, Consolidated Natural Gas Foundation joined with the Education Fund to develop the College Bound Program, a three-year initiative to encourage more of West Virginia's high school graduates to attend college or other post-secondary training. The goals of the program include:

- Identifying and lessening financial, attitudinal, and other barriers, real or perceived, that affect parents' and students' decisions about college attendance;
- Functioning as a convener around this issue, and as a clearinghouse and resource for educators, students, parents, and community and business members; and,
- Increasing and enhancing awareness about our changing economic base and promoting realistic avenues for students to prepare successfully for the future.

The college attendance rate in 1987 was approximately 32 percent of our high school graduates. The current rate is about 45 percent. While part of this increase reflects improved data collection, the real increase that has been experienced is confirmed by the higher freshmen enrollments in many of our state's public and private colleges and universities.

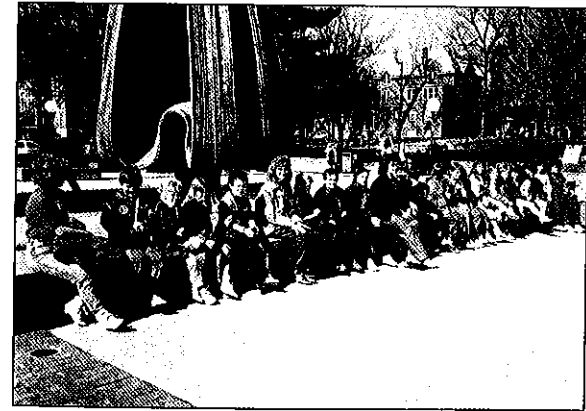


Among the Education Fund's efforts in this program are "A Day on Campus," the "West Virginia College Sort," the "West Virginia Scholarship Directory," and the "Think College" Grants already described in a previous section of this report.

"A Day on Campus," sponsored by Ashland Oil, Inc., provides an opportunity for schools to take students in grades four through nine to visit a college or university campus in West Virginia. Funds help the public schools pay for transportation or other costs of the visit. Every college and university in the state participates in the program, and offers meaningful and memorable activities to acquaint the children with college life and opportunities. More than 14,000 students from 295 schools have visited colleges as a result of this activity, and 833 parents have accompanied them. "A most wonderful aspect of this program," according to Robert Owen, communications executive for Ashland Oil, Inc., "is that it encourages parents to participate as chaperones on the visits, and this creates an opportunity for the parents and the students to learn together what college is all about in West Virginia."

"The West Virginia College Sort" is a computer program designed and updated by Mr. Joe Lupia, and donated to the Education Fund. It provides detailed information about each of West Virginia's institutions of higher learning. It includes a directory of institutions, their programs, costs, campus characteristics, and activities. It includes letters for students to complete requesting academic bulletins and application forms from specific colleges. The computer program has been distributed at no cost to all of the state's high schools.

The "West Virginia Scholarship Directory" is a publication listing private sector scholarships available to students in West Virginia. The Education Fund surveyed state businesses asking for information on scholarships they offer, and identified 267 opportunities for West Virginia



students. Copies of the directory were sent to all state high schools, colleges, and public libraries.

In addition to these efforts, the Education Fund participated in the planning and execution of the West Virginia University Extension Service's Mentor Program. This event focused on a special weekend training for 67 college students who were trained to serve as mentors for high school students from their home towns. The event, sponsored by CNG Foundation, provided the participants with information and materials to conduct workshops and career awareness events for students at their high schools.



Outstanding Educator Merit Awards

Consistent with the goal of encouraging excellence and innovation in education, the Education Fund established the annual Outstanding Educator Merit Awards Program in 1987. The program is designed to:

- Recognize and reward outstanding innovation and creativity in teaching and administering West Virginia public schools;
- Bring the outstanding accomplishments of educators to the forefront of public awareness;
- Increase general public knowledge of and appreciation for the contributions of educators within the K-12 system; and,
- Demonstrate to educators that the business and industry leadership in West Virginia values their commitment and their contributions.

Cash awards of \$5,000 were available to educators in this program. C & P Telephone Company of West Virginia sponsored one award each for outstanding elementary school teacher, outstanding secondary school teacher, outstanding elementary school principal, and outstanding secondary school principal. In addition, the West Virginia Council of Economic Education and the West Virginia Enterprise and Education Foundation jointly sponsored one award for outstanding teacher of economics.

Applicants or nominees were full-time employees of public schools in West Virginia. Based on the review of written information submitted on behalf of or by the candidates, the West Virginia Education Fund Board of Directors selected three finalists in each of the five categories of the awards program. Subcommittees of the Board visited the schools of the finalists to gather additional data and to validate

the application materials. The finalists were honored at a special banquet in May 1990. All finalists were presented with a plaque expressing appreciation for their commitment to West Virginia school children, and one winner in each of the five categories received a personal check for \$5,000.

Sponsored by a special grant from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, the Education Fund published this year the West Virginia High School Handbook. This book, compiled by Ridge and Valley Researchers, provides comparative data on all of West Virginia's high schools, and gives demographic data about the counties in which these schools are located.

Other publications of the Education Fund include Network News, a quarterly newsletter providing information for participants in the Education Fund's Partnerships in Education Program. Additional publications provide periodic program information for schools, communities, businesses and individuals.

The West Virginia Education Fund was designed from the earliest planning stages to involve the widest range of community interests in the development of the organization. It strives to create mutual trust and relationships, and avoids finger-pointing or the casting of blame for education's problems. It offers programs which, although valuable in themselves, act strategically to strengthen the primary role as a third-party broker and covenor of interest in and resources for the schools. The Education Fund is not a temporary or quick fix, but tries instead to be an agent for change.

No two communities in West Virginia are exactly alike, but there has been in practically every part of the state a local recognition of the need for renewal of the community's interest in its schools. The Education Fund has developed a broad new constituency for public school education. This new education-community network provides a mechanism through which school and community leaders are working together to address the many education issues of our time.

The task now is to continue to build this constituency and nurture the grassroots efforts that are being made toward real reform. Simple and direct steps, such as the programs of the Education Fund, are proving to be effective paths toward excellence.

Please join us in helping to prepare the children of West Virginia to lead our state into a brighter future.

Notes to Financial Statements

JUNE 30, 1990

NOTE 1—SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

GENERAL—The West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. (the Fund) was established in 1983 as a nonstock corporation under the laws of the State of West Virginia and is classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax-exempt organization under the provisions of Code Sec. 501(c)(3). The primary purpose of the West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. is to advance the quality of public education in West Virginia schools.

The various programs of the Fund consist of Classroom Minigrants, Partnerships in Education, Outstanding Educator Merit Awards and College Bound. The Classroom Minigrants program awards grants to deserving teachers to support their innovative projects for which funding would otherwise be unavailable. In the Partnerships in Education programs, schools and businesses or other private sector organizations work together for a cooperative, mutually beneficial relationship. The Outstanding Educator Merit Award program is designed to recognize outstanding teachers and principals serving grades kindergarten through twelve. The College Bound program was established to encourage more high school graduates to attend college or other post secondary training. The Fund also provides a discretionary fund for the State Superintendent of Schools. Funding for these programs is principally by gifts and grants from individual corporations, foundations, and others.

FURNISHINGS AND EQUIPMENT—Donated furnishings and equipment are not recorded by the Fund, due to the insignificance of dollar amount and the difficulty of determining value. Purchased furniture and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

GRANTS AND AWARDS—Grants and awards are recorded as expense in the period in which they are approved by the Board of Directors. Grants payable at year end consist of grants approved and awarded but not disbursed. Refunds of the unexpended portion of grants are netted against expense in the period the refunds are received.

EXPENDABLE RESTRICTED RESOURCES—Gifts or grants restricted by the donor, grantor, or other outside party for particular purposes are deemed to be earned and reported as revenues when expenditures in compliance with the specific restrictions have been incurred. Prior to meeting specified restrictions, such gift or grant revenue is deferred.

PLEDGES—Legally enforceable pledges are recorded as receivables in the year made. Pledges for support of current operations are recorded as revenue. Pledges for support of future operations are recorded as deferred revenue. If the donor does not specify which period is being supported, revenue is recognized when payments are scheduled to be received.

FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES—The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of revenue and support, expenses and changes in fund balance. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

NOTE 2—PENSION PLAN

As of January 1, 1985, the Fund established a defined contribution pension plan for all full-time employees. Monthly contributions equal to 8% of an employee's monthly compensation are required under the Plan. Contributions are funded as accrued. Total expense was \$10,734 for 1990 and \$10,408 for 1989.

NOTE 3—FUNDRAISING COSTS

During the year ended June 30, 1990, the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation provided grant funds to finance a full-time financial development employee. The entire salary and related costs included as fundraising costs in the financial statements were paid for from the Benedum Foundation Grant.
