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President's Message

During the eighth year since the founding of the West Virginia Education Fund, we witnessed unparalleled national emphasis on the quality and adequacy of public education. President Bush's recently released national education goals include preschool preparedness, increase in high school graduation rates and demonstrated competency in challenging subject matter. The strategy to accomplish these goals emphasizes local community involvement as an essential element for the realization of real progress.

Since 1983 the West Virginia Education Fund has been building this bond between community and public schools. Evidence linking student achievement with committed communities, teachers and parents is compelling, and it is gratifying to know that the nation is now confirming the importance of the initiatives adopted by the founders of the Education Fund to encourage excellence in the public schools of our state.

The Minigrants Program has enriched curriculum in nearly every school during the life of the Education Fund. Anecdotal evidence continues to reinforce the benefits to teachers, and especially to students, derived from the creative ideas for classroom activities to enhance learning generated by these grants.

The more recently adopted Parental Involvement Awards Program, which was prompted by the well established fact that student achievement is associated with the level of parental interest in their education and by the success of the Minigrant Program, has encouraged innovative concepts designed to involve parents in the public education process. Many of the activities prompted by these modest grants are carried on beyond the funded period and are gradually convincing parents that their ongoing participation in public education is a critical factor in improving school performance and student interest in learning.

A flagship program and model for other states has been our highly successful Partnerships in Education Program, which has linked businesses and other community organizations with public schools, and has established a strong new constituency for schools in West Virginia. A true partnership relation is created wherein both parties derive benefit. The school gains from the professional assistance provided by specialists from various disciplines, and by volunteer and, in some cases, financial support. The business is rewarded

through recognition, its influence on the preparation of the students and its ability to enhance understanding of its mission.

A deepening concern with regard to the college entry rate for high school graduates led to our College Bound Program which provides opportunity for students in grades four through nine to visit a college or university campus ("A Day on Campus") in West Virginia each year. This familiarization program, coupled with an annually published scholarship directory and curriculum offerings of these institutions, has improved student knowledge of higher education opportunities, and has assisted parents' understanding of available financial assistance.

These proven programs have enhanced the opportunities for improved learning in our public schools, have encouraged teachers to be innovative and creative, and have caused the broader community to recognize the importance of their participation in the education process. Further definition of these programs appears on other pages of this annual report.

As the nation embarks upon a quantum leap in education reform, the Education Fund has accepted additional challenges. The Board has endorsed a number of new initiatives that will permit us to examine critically elements of the public education system, enhance the management of schools and engage more citizens in a classroom reading program. Out of this decision to enlarge the scope of public education issues, an Education Policy Research initiative was born. Its genesis is the premise that good information and analysis will lead to better understanding of the public education system which will in turn bring about fundamental change resulting in long-term benefit for student learning. Issues related to how we manage, finance and evaluate our public schools will eventually be addressed and presented in an objective manner as a resource for decision making.

Another exciting new program, Schools Ahead—21, will recognize individual programs or actions employed by public schools that have demonstrated an added dimension to the education process. The incentive offered by these awards will encourage innovative thinking and planning among teachers, administrators, interested parents and others in the community. Our goal is to make schools an exciting place for both students and teachers.

A third and most recently adopted program, Read Aloud West Virginia, was added as a result of an appeal by a group of active volunteers who had been conducting this program successfully in seven counties, the earliest dating back to 1986. Because of the success of this activity in exposing members of the community to a classroom experience to demonstrate the joy of reading to the early grades, the Education Fund was sought to implement this program throughout the state.

Finally, the Education Fund has been designated by the West Virginia Business and Education Alliance as the agent for promoting greater business participation in school improvement councils. Expertise provided by business representatives introduce the element of critical thinking valuable to the school personnel in their planning and decision making.

Much has been achieved in eight years, but many more opportunities exist to improve significantly the performance of our public schools. There are encouraging examples of excellence in teaching and progress in student performance, but the number must be increased. The future well being of our children and, in fact, the preservation of our democratic society, hinges upon a well educated public body. The Education Fund mission is to facilitate change in public schools so that each child will be afforded the best achievable opportunity for a good education.

The support of our contributors, especially the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, Union Carbide Corporation, C & P Telephone Company of West Virginia, Ashland Oil Foundation and the Sarah and Pauline Maier Foundation, have enabled the Education Fund to make a meaningful difference in the learning opportunities for the children of our state, and we express our deepest appreciation for this commitment to our endeavor.

It has been my privilege to serve as President of the Education Fund and particularly to work with an exceptionally committed staff, Board of Directors, and our superbly talented and energetic Executive Director, Vivian Kidd.



Introduction

The West Virginia Education Fund is founded on the theory that the private sector has an important role in assuring that quality public school education is afforded to all children. Enlightened communities acknowledge that quality education pays substantial dividends through employability, increased production, and the personal satisfaction of individuals. The mission of the Education Fund is to advance the quality of public education (through grade 12) in West Virginia by:

- promoting cooperation and communication between the public schools and the private sector
- recognizing and encouraging excellence and innovation in teaching and the learning process
- providing students and teachers with a realistic picture of the world of work and better understanding of the preparation needed for employment

-being a resource in optimizing the system of public education in West Virginia

The strategy of the Education Fund is to pursue this mission through a number of programs, grants and activities that will provide resources for innovation, encourage excellence in the classroom, develop greater public involvement in public education and provide better information for decision making.

Information in the back of this report reflects the 1990-91 fiscal condition of the organization. In the program descriptions found elsewhere in the report, an attempt has been made to provide more current data because the activities of the Education Fund have expanded greatly during the last several months.

Support for the organization continues to come from individuals, businesses, organizations, corporations, and foundations. While the Education Fund has continued to receive substantial financial support from the Claude

Worthington Benedum Foundation, West Virginia's businesses, individuals, and organizations are playing an increasingly greater role in providing the resources to provide these benefits for the state's public schools.

Programs and Activities

Pages that follow provide a detailed look at some of the following programs and activities of the Education Fund:

Minigrants for Classroom Projects — Small grants that are offered annually to public school teachers to conduct special, innovative projects for which no public funds are available. These projects must be innovative and they must directly involve the students in ways that enhance their classroom learning experiences.

Parental Involvement Awards — Small grants that are offered annually to educators and community members who wish to develop innovative school-based projects that will get parents more involved in the education of their children.

Partnerships in Education — A program that links individual schools with businesses or community organizations in mutually cooperative and beneficial relationships. The goal of the program is to enhance the learning experiences of the students and reduce the isolation of the schools from their communities. The program is commonly referred to as "a handshake, not a handout," as it focuses on the sharing of human resources and expertise rather than financial support.

College Bound — A program that brings attention and resources to address the need to increase the number of high school graduates in West Virginia who attend college or other post-secondary training.

Schools Ahead 21 — A new program designed to recognize schools that are doing an outstanding job of preparing students for success in the 21st Century. A monetary award is given to schools in recognition of exemplary programs that meet particular criteria. Not intended to support proposals for new programs, Schools Ahead 21 awards are made for accomplishment

in helping students look toward the future effectively. Awards in this program may be used by the school for projects the faculty decides will be useful as they move forward in their pursuit of excellence.

Education Policy Research Institute — A new initiative to explore core policy issues in public school education. This effort is intended to provide good information and analysis which will lead to better understanding of the education system. Issues related to how we manage, finance and evaluate our public schools will eventually be addressed and presented in an objective manner as a resource for good decision making.

West Virginia Business and Education Alliance—The National Business Roundtable, in cooperation with the nation's governors, are involved in an effort to improve public education. That initiative in West Virginia is chaired by Mr. John Hall of Ashland Oil, and is being conducted by the West Virginia Education Fund. The plan in West Virginia starts with an effort to energize local school improvement councils.

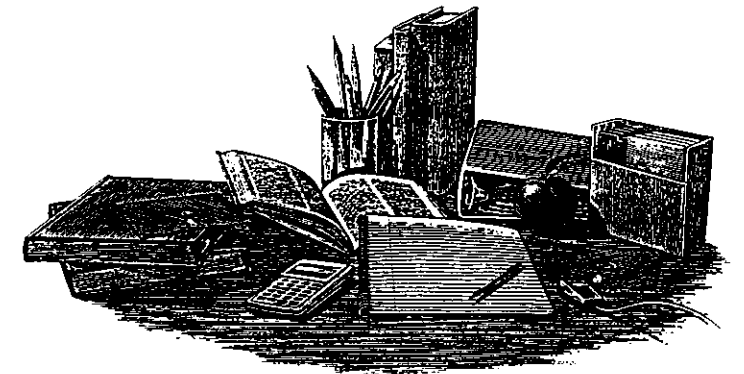
Read Aloud West Virginia — Started by a group of volunteers in Kanawha County, this highly successful intergenerational program teaches children the joy of reading and the benefits that follow. The Board of Directors of Read Aloud West Virginia petitioned to become a program of the West Virginia Education Fund. Because of its compatibility with the Education Fund's goals, mission and programs, Read Aloud was accepted as a program so that its benefits can be provided for children in every West Virginia county.

Occasional publications — Two publications, were developed to serve as resources for educators. *Teachers' Link to Community Resources* is a book resulting from a survey of

business and community organizations throughout the state in which they indicated what resources, programs or opportunities for education they are providing or are willing to provide. The publication is indexed by industry type and by geographical area so that teachers can contact community members nearby who are willing to provide particular programs or learning activities for schools.

The second publication, entitled *A Teacher's Guide to Grants & Programs*, is jointly published by the Education Fund, the West Virginia Humanities Council and the West Virginia Department of Education. It provides a combined listing of grants available to teachers and schools from three statewide granting agencies.

In addition, a quarterly newsletter, *Network News*, provides information about activities of schools and businesses in the Partnerships in Education program, and occasionally provides new program and general education information.



Minigrants for Classroom Projects is a program designed to support teachers' innovative, often long-cherished, ideas for creative projects which benefit students, but for which no public funds are available. Minigrants are cash awards offered annually on a competitive basis to teachers in all 55 counties of the state. In addition to the enhanced learning experiences afforded students by these grants, the program also recognizes the efforts of outstanding teachers and draws attention to the positive efforts of schools, teachers and students. Proposals from teachers are reviewed by committees of volunteers representative of business, education, and civic groups. Review committees look for the academic value and the creative or innovative nature of the proposals. Whenever appropriate, specific recommendations are made for revising project proposals to stand a more favorable chance of meeting the criteria for funding.

A continuing relationship between the Education Fund and the county school administrators ensures that projects recommended for funding are complementary to the counties' educational objectives. Review committees reviewed almost 1,000 proposals from teachers and funded 230 projects.

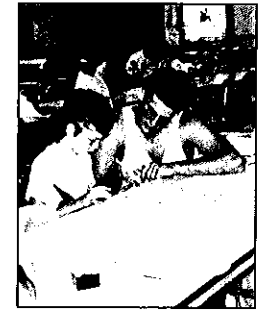

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The West Virginia Education Fund serves as a broker to link individual schools with individual businesses for cooperative, mutually beneficial relationships. The program, called Partnerships in Education, combines the energies and resources of the partners to enrich the educational process. Partnerships foster special bonds of cooperation, understanding and respect among schools, businesses and employees or other private sector partners, and communities. They provide a means for schools and students to benefit from local resources and talents.

More than 725 of the state's public schools have been linked with a business or community organization since the Education Fund started the Partnerships in Education Program in 1984. Twenty-two counties have partners for all their schools, and the program is active in all 55 county school districts in the state.

The objectives of the program are:

- To bring business people into the schools to work with the students, teachers and administrators on projects which school people think will be helpful and business people feel qualified to accomplish;
- To give students and teachers a realistic picture of the business world and of the preparation students need for success;
- To supplement classroom studies with relevant learning experiences in business and industry; and
- To give business people an understanding of the education system, how it works, its strengths and its problems.

Providing regular positive contact with people from business not only helps to reduce the isolation of the schools from the communities they serve, but also gives students a view of the work world, its opportunities and expectations. It is a view they are not as likely to find in the pages of a textbook or within the walls of the classroom.

Partnerships in Education in West Virginia has been a phenomenal success. That success can be

attributed to thousands of volunteers from both the schools and businesses who expend time and energy beyond that which is required because they want to ensure that students receive the best possible learning experiences.

EXAMPLES OF ACTIVITIES IN PARTNERSHIPS IN EDUCATION:

It is very important to note that the Partnerships in Education Program creates an ongoing, long-term relationship between the school people and the business people. Each successful Partnership has a steering committee consisting of individuals from the school and from the business who meet on a regular basis to determine the needs of the school and how they can best work together to advance student achievement. Partnerships in which only one representative of the business and one representative of the school are involved generally are not successful in the long term.

The following examples of activities are intended to provide a flavor of what happens as a result of the program. Most of these activities were conducted as small parts of overall strategies in schools to reach particular goals.

- A local college provided volunteer mentors and tutors to broaden the intellectual, cultural and social horizons of rural elementary school students.
- Employees of a community organization spent six weeks in the classroom teaching students about wildlife, wildlife management and conservation.
- Students received instruction and guidance for their auto racing team from a local business. Students are responsible for all the managerial and technical aspects of the program.
- Scientists provided students with instruction to conduct a science project and gave winners of the science fair the opportunity to study in a laboratory with the scientists.
- A company developed a program to allow students interested in office technology to

receive practical experience through working in various departments of the company.

- Journalism students learned to write effectively and produce printed materials through instruction from a company's publication staff.
- A business invited students to participate in an outdoor learning event, teaching them teamwork, critical thinking and group decision making.
- Students served as demonstrators for its business partner's statewide promotional event.
- Teachers developed a parenting handbook providing valuable parenting tips for their business partner's employees who have children.
- A school made its fitness trail available to its business partner which was instituting a wellness program for its employees.
- Students in a building technology class installed golf shelters for a company, permitting the students to gain valuable experience while assisting their partner company.
- A school provided a regular column for its business partner in the school newsletter that students, teachers, parents and the community could learn more about the business.
- An elementary school offered college students majoring in education additional learning opportunities by allowing them to teach children's literature classes and tutor young children.
- Students designed and produced unique safety posters which are displayed at the partner company.

These are among the hundreds of activities occurring daily among school-business partnerships in West Virginia. The Education Fund quarterly newsletter, *Network News*, describes many additional activities, and it is available upon request.

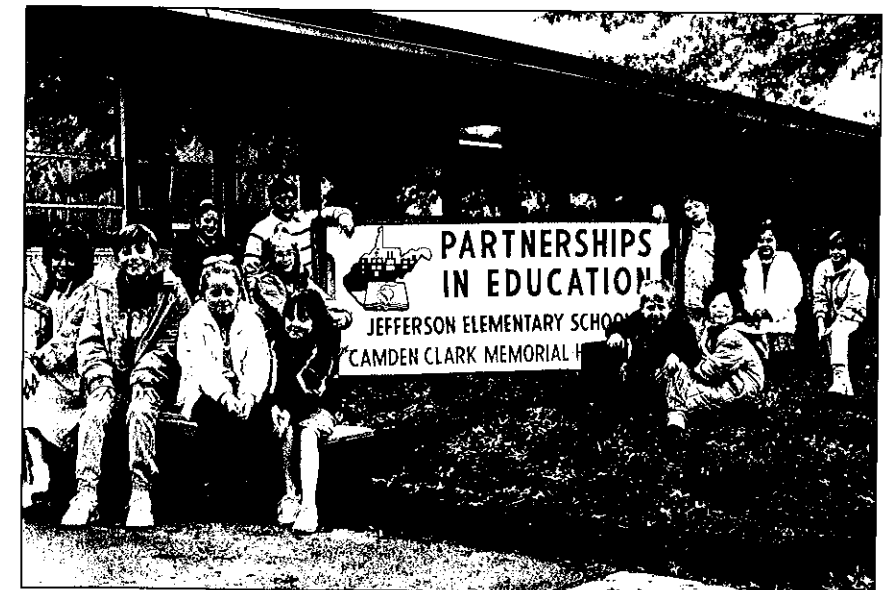

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College Bound

The College Bound Program of the West Virginia Education Fund was created in 1987 through a three-year grant from Consolidated Natural Gas Foundation. The fourth year of the program was sponsored in part by the Sarah and Pauline Maier Foundation. The goals of the program include:

- Identifying and lessening financial, attitudinal and other barriers, real or perceived, that affect parents' and students' decisions about college;
- Functioning as a convener around this issue and as a clearinghouse and resource for educators, students, parents and community and business members; and
- Increasing and enhancing awareness about the changing economic base and promoting realistic avenues for students to prepare successfully for the future.

In 1987 approximately 32 percent of West Virginia's high school graduates were enrolling in college or other post-secondary training. The current rate is about 45 percent. While the increase is partly due to improved data collection, a significant real increase is confirmed by the larger freshmen enrollment experienced by most of the state's public and private colleges and universities.



The elements of the College Bound Program include "A Day on Campus," the "West Virginia College Sort," the "West Virginia Scholarship Directory," and "Think College" Grants.

In early 1988, "A Day on Campus" was started to provide the opportunity for students in grades four through nine to visit college and university campuses in West Virginia. Over 22,000 students have visited the state's public and private institutions of higher learning since the program started. They have been accompanied by 1,045 parents and other adult chaperones, some of whom have enrolled in college as a result of their visit. "A Day on Campus" is sponsored by Ashland Oil, Inc.

The "West Virginia College Sort" is a computer program that provides detailed information about every college and university in West Virginia. The program was designed by Mr. Joe Lupia of Wheeling. He donated the program to the Education Fund and updates the information every two years. The program is distributed to high school principals and guidance counselors and to college admissions people. It is available with a user's guide. The program facilitates comparisons of various institutions for students and their parents.

The *Scholarship Directory* is published annually to provide information to students and their parents about the private sector scholarships that are available to West Virginia students. The publication lists over 100 scholarships and is sent to high schools and colleges, and copies are available upon request.

"Think College" Grants were available on a competitive basis up to \$1,000 each for school-based projects to encourage students to consider attending college. Educators and community members were encouraged to consider such projects for any age levels from kindergarten through the twelfth grade, rather



than to focus only on high school juniors and seniors. "Think College" Grants were sponsored through a grant from the West Virginia Insurance Coalition.





INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

Notes to Financial Statements

JUNE 30, 1991

NOTE 1—SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

GENERAL—The West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. (the Fund) was established in 1983 as a nonstock corporation under the laws of the State of West Virginia and is classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax-exempt organization under the provisions of Code Sec. 501(c)(3). The primary purpose of the West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. is to advance the quality of public education in West Virginia schools.

The programs of the Fund consist of Classroom Minigrants, Partnerships in Education, College Bound, and various other programs. The Classroom Minigrants program awards grants to deserving teachers to support their innovative projects for which funding would otherwise be unavailable. In the Partnerships in Education program, schools and businesses or other private sector organizations work together for a cooperative, mutually beneficial relationship. The College Bound program was established to encourage more high school graduates to attend college or other post secondary training. Funding for these programs is principally by gifts and grants from individuals, corporations, foundations, and others.

SHORT-TERM INVESTMENTS—Short-term investments consist primarily of federally-insured certificates of deposit with maturities ranging from 90 days to two years.

FURNISHINGS AND EQUIPMENT—Donated furnishings and equipment are not recorded by the Fund, due to the insignificance of dollar amount and the difficulty of determining value. Purchased furniture and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

GRANTS AND AWARDS—Grants and awards are recorded as expense in the period in which they are approved by the Board of Directors. Grants payable at year end consist of grants approved and awarded but not disbursed. Refunds of the unexpended portion of grants are netted against expense in the period the refunds are received.

EXPENDABLE RESTRICTED RESOURCES—Gifts or grants restricted by the donor, grantor, or other outside party for particular purposes are deemed to be earned and reported as revenues when expenditures in compliance with the specific restrictions have been incurred. Prior to meeting specified restrictions, such gift or grant revenue is deferred.

PLEDGES—Legally enforceable pledges are recorded as receivables in the year made. Pledges for support of current operations are recorded as revenue. Pledges for support of future operations are recorded as deferred revenue. If the donor does not specify which period is being supported, revenue is recognized when payments are scheduled to be received.

Pledges are received from foundations, businesses, and individuals who are located in or have an interest in the State of West Virginia. Substantially all of the total pledges receivable are due from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation.

FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES—The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statements of revenue and support, expenses and changes in fund balance. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

NOTE 2—PENSION PLAN

As of January 1, 1985, the Fund established a defined contribution pension plan for all full-time employees. Monthly contributions equal to 8% of an employee's monthly compensation are required under the Plan. Contributions are funded as accrued. Total expense was \$18,032 for 1991 and \$10,734 for 1990.

NOTE 3—FUNDRAISING COSTS

During the year ended June 30, 1990, the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation provided grant funds to finance a full-time financial development employee. The entire salary and related costs included as fundraising costs in the financial statements were paid for from the Benedum Foundation Grant.
