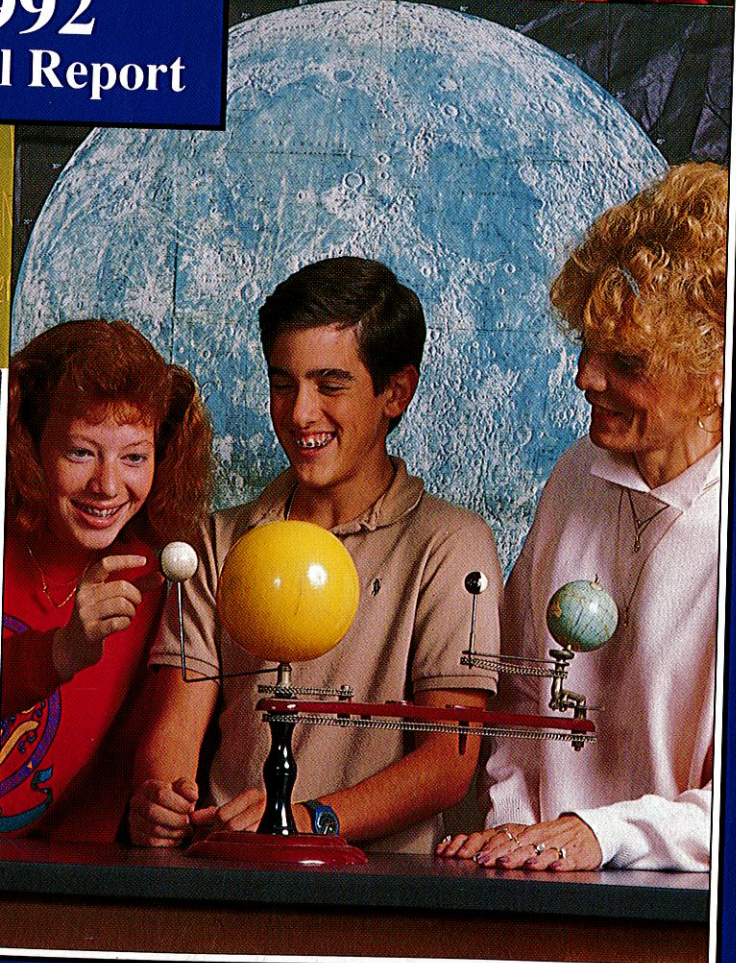

President's Message

As we conclude the West Virginia Education Fund's ninth year, evidence of the wisdom of its creators is abundantly clear. Its mission and earlier initiatives have positioned the Fund to be a major participant in the current movement to enhance and reform public school education.

The Fund was established in 1983 with the premise that private sector initiatives in support of public schools can make a difference in improving the quality of education available to West Virginia students. At that time, two flagship programs of the Fund evolved: Minigrants and Partnerships in Education. Those programs have established the credibility of the Fund as an effective, professional organization in promoting excellence in education.

Today, the Education Fund directs the efforts of seven programs, each addressing an essential component necessary to improve the quality of teaching and learning in our public schools.

We can reflect on our accomplishments with pride:

In the past nine years our Minigrants program has awarded 1,774 small competitive grants to teachers for innovative educational projects that otherwise might not have received funding.

With more than 780 schools participating in September 1992, our Partnerships in Education program has achieved an 80% penetration rate of the public schools in the state. Over 8,000 adults and 280,000 students have been involved in this collaboration which uses business talent and resources to enhance learning opportunities.

Our College Bound program was created to stimulate greater student interest in college attendance. Since 1987 we have seen over 26,000 students, grades four through eight, visit a West Virginia college campus for a one-day orientation, as well as a significant increase in college enrollment.

A new program, Schools Ahead-21, presented cash awards in recognition of nine innovative academic programs that are preparing students for success in the 21st century.

Read Aloud West Virginia, also new to the Fund, involves community volunteers as readers for elementary school students. It seeks to develop-lifetime readers, a key ingredient to success as an adult, by promoting the joy of reading and the benefits that follow. The program has expanded to serve 20 counties.

The West Virginia Business & Education Alliance was established in early 1992 to imple-

ment the education initiatives of the national Business Roundtable in the state. We have recruited and trained 50 volunteer county coordinators from business and industry to help us energize local school improvement councils around the state. We have also published a document designed to assist school improvement councils in becoming more effective agents for educational reform at the local level.

The first product of our Education Policy Research Institute, published in December 1992, is a comprehensive analysis of public school funding in West Virginia. It is expected to be a useful resource to the public in resolving issues related to public school support and the beginning of an extensive analysis of broad issues which influence the effectiveness of public school education.

Reflection upon our programs and the vast number of students, parents, teachers, school administrators and community leaders who have participated provides positive reassurance that private sector involvement can make a positive contribution to public school improvement.

However, we continue to examine critically what we do and how well we do it, to be ever conscious of more effective ways to improve the public school system. We want West Virginia to be the model in providing a quality education for all of our children in public schools.

The confidence and commitment of our loyal and generous individual, corporate and foundation contributors has allowed the Fund to assume a major role in realizing national and state public education reform objectives. Special recognition is due the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, C & P Telephone Company of West Virginia, Ashland Oil Foundation, Union Carbide Corporation and the Sarah and Pauline Maier Foundation who, along with the many others noted in this annual report, deserve our deep appreciation for their support.

As President of the Education Fund, I have been supported by a very competent and dedicated staff during the past year. It has also been my special privilege to have witnessed another year of exceptional leadership by our executive director, Vivian Kidd, who is most responsible for the growth and prominence of the Fund.

Introduction

The West Virginia Education Fund is distinguished as the nation's first statewide education fund, founded in 1983 as a catalyst for private sector involvement in public school improvement. Since that time the Education Fund has developed an impressive portfolio of programs and activities that provide resources for innovation among educators, encourage excellence in the classroom, develop greater public involvement in public education and provide better information for decision making.

While seemingly diverse, these programs share a single focus — to assure that quality public school education is available to all children in West Virginia.

The West Virginia Education Fund further seeks to advance the quality of education in the state by:

- promoting cooperation and communication between public schools and the private sector
- recognizing and encouraging excellence and innovation in teaching and the learning process
- providing students and teachers with a realistic picture of the world of work and better understanding of the preparation needed for employment
- being a resource in optimizing the system of public education in West Virginia

While the Education Fund has continued to receive substantial support from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, West Virginia individuals, businesses, organizations, corporations and foundations are playing an increasingly greater role in providing the resources to benefit the state's public schools.

Programs and Activities

The following is a summary of the programs and activities of the West Virginia Education Fund. More detailed descriptions of many of these programs are presented in subsequent pages of this report.

Minigrants for Classroom Projects

These competitive, small grants are offered annually to public school teachers to conduct special, innovative projects for which no funds are available. Teachers requesting these grants must demonstrate how the project will directly involve students in ways that enhance their classroom learning experience.

Parental Involvement Awards

Educators and community members who wish to get parents more involved in the education of their children are invited to apply for these small grants to develop innovative school-based programs.

Partnerships in Education

The goal of this program, which links individual schools with businesses or community organizations, is to enhance the learning experiences of the students and reduce the isolation of the schools from their communities. The program is described as "a handshake, not a handout," as it focuses on the sharing of human resources and expertise rather than financial support.

A quarterly newsletter, *Network News*, provides information about activities of schools and businesses in the Partnerships in Education program as well as providing new program and general education information.

College Bound

This program seeks to focus attention and resources on the need to increase the number of high school graduates in West Virginia who attend college or other post-secondary training. It includes "A Day on Campus," the WV College-Sort computer program and a directory of private sector scholarship information.

Schools Ahead-21

These monetary awards recognize exemplary school programs that are doing an outstanding

job of preparing students for success in the 21st century by helping them look toward the future. Not intended to support proposals for new programs, Schools Ahead-21 awards may be used by the school to continue in their pursuit of excellence.

Education Policy Research Institute

This initiative is intended to explore core policy issues in public school education, providing accurate information and analysis which will lead to better understanding of the education system. Issues related to how we manage, finance and evaluate our public schools will eventually be addressed and objectively presented as a resource for good decision making.

WV Business & Education Alliance

The national Business Roundtable (BRT), in cooperation with the nation's governors, has made a 10-year commitment to improving education in each of the nation's states. The BRT's effort in West Virginia is chaired by Mr. John Hall, chairman and CEO of Ashland Oil, Inc. The West Virginia Education Fund was selected to head this important initiative. A separate unit of the Fund, the WV Business & Education Alliance, has been established to implement the program, initially working through local school improvement councils. During its first year, the Alliance has successfully recruited and trained volunteer county coordinators from businesses around the state to assist in energizing the school improvement councils in their respective counties.

Read Aloud West Virginia

This highly successful intergenerational program is designed to develop lifetime readers, a key ingredient to success as an adult, by promoting "the joy of reading and the benefits that follow." Community volunteers are recruited and trained to serve as readers in classrooms and other public settings. The goal of the program is to establish Read Aloud programs in each county in West Virginia as another avenue to provide community support for schools.

Minigrants Award Winners

Minigrants for Classroom Projects is a program designed to support teachers' innovative ideas for creative projects which benefit students, but for which no public funds are available. These small cash awards are offered annually on a competitive basis to teachers in all 55 counties of the state.

Proposals from teachers are reviewed by committees of volunteers representing business, education and civic groups (see page 14). A continuing relationship between the Education Fund and the county school administrators ensures that projects under review are complementary to the counties' educational objectives. Awards are based on the academic value and creative or innovative nature of the proposals. When appropriate, review committees may recommend specific revisions to a project proposal to improve its chance for future funding.

While students benefit from the enhanced learning experiences afforded by the program's grants, there are other advantages. By recognizing the efforts of outstanding West Virginia teachers, the program draws positive attention to the state's schools, teachers and students.

Review committees evaluated nearly 1,000 proposals from teachers in all 55 states and approved the funding of the following 233 projects:

Schools Ahead-21

Schools Ahead-21, a creation of the West Virginia Education Fund, is sponsored by C & P Telephone. It recognizes and provides incentives for programs that are preparing students for success in the 21st century. Schools Ahead-21 recognizes the successful accomplishments and creativity of proven individual programs rather than proposals for new programs or a school as a whole.

One award of \$4,000 and two awards of \$2,000 each are available in each of three categories: elementary, junior high/middle school and high school. Monetary awards do not have to be used for the nominated program, but may be determined by mutual agreement of the winning school's faculty senate and the West Virginia Education Fund.

The focus of the program and elements which are foremost in the selection process are student achievement, professional development, teamwork among faculty and community, private sector involvement and the preparation of students for success in the 21st century. All public schools, grades K-12, are eligible for recognition, but may only submit one program per school for consideration.

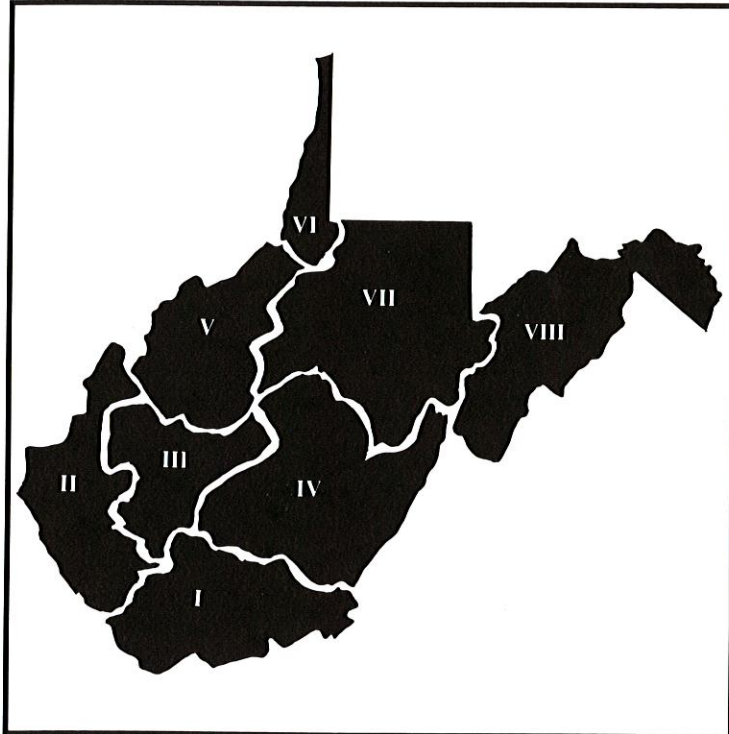

Partnerships in Education

Through its Partnerships in Education program, the West Virginia Education Fund serves as an intermediary to link individual schools with individual businesses for cooperative, mutually beneficial relationships. By combining the talents, energies and resources of partners to enrich the educational process, special bonds of cooperation, understanding and respect are forged between schools, businesses and employees and communities.

Since the Education Fund started the Partnerships in Education program in 1984, more than 780 of the state's public schools, in all 55 counties, have been paired with a business or community organization.

The objectives of the program are:

- To bring business people into the schools to work with the students, teachers and administrators on projects which school people think will be helpful and business people feel qualified to accomplish;
- To give students and teachers a realistic picture of the business world and of the preparation students need for success;
- To supplement classroom studies with relevant learning experiences in business and industry; and
- To give business people an understanding of the education system, how it works, its strengths and problems.

Regular positive contact with business partners helps to reduce the isolation of the schools from the communities they serve and gives students a realistic view of the opportunities and expectations of the working world.

The Partnerships in Education Program seeks to create an ongoing, long-term relationship between the school and business representatives. Each successful Partnership has a steering committee consisting of individuals from both the school and business who meet on a regular basis to determine the needs of the school and how they can best work together to advance student achievement. Partnerships which involve only one representative of the school and one representative of the business are generally not successful in the long term.

The following examples of Partnership activities are intended to provide the essence of the program. Most of these activities were conducted as small parts of overall strategies in schools to reach specific goals.

Business employees provided an electrical safety course to students which focused on the dangers of flying kites near power wires and power stations.

A business worked with educators to incorporate a culinary arts program into the school's curriculum. The program enables students to learn about franchise operation, developing menus, preparing foods for special dietary needs and so forth.

Representatives of a business are helping students identify and research various plants, trees and flowers

in a "science lab" behind the school.

A business invited students from its various partner schools to participate in a competitive Academic Bowl, which exercised the students' knowledge in math, science, social studies and language arts.

Students spent a day as "store associates," gaining experience in stocking shelves, handling customer checkouts, using the store's computer system and making employee work schedules.

A business and a school instituted a student health club which encourages students to acquire healthy habits, learn more about being hospitalized and obtain knowledge about various health professions.

A school and a business worked together to acquire a grant for a college bound program designed to increase the school's college-going rate.

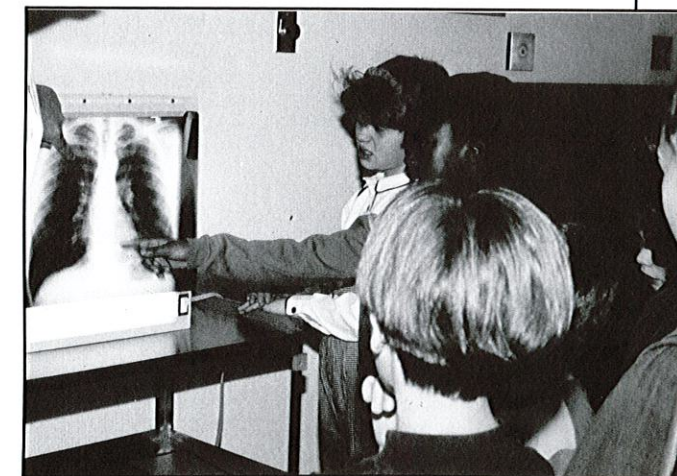
Teachers provide training to business employees in the areas of proper study habits and how to take a test.

Students write articles for the company's national publication, thus providing students' perspectives on how company involvement is beneficial to them.

Teachers provide examples of summer activities for children which are used as public service announcements by the school's business partner.

These are among the hundreds of activities occurring daily among school-business partnerships in West Virginia. The Education Fund's quarterly newsletter, *Network News*, describes many additional activities and is available upon request.

The success of Partnerships in Education can be attributed to the thousands of volunteers from both the schools and businesses whose time and energy ensure that students receive the best possible learning experiences.

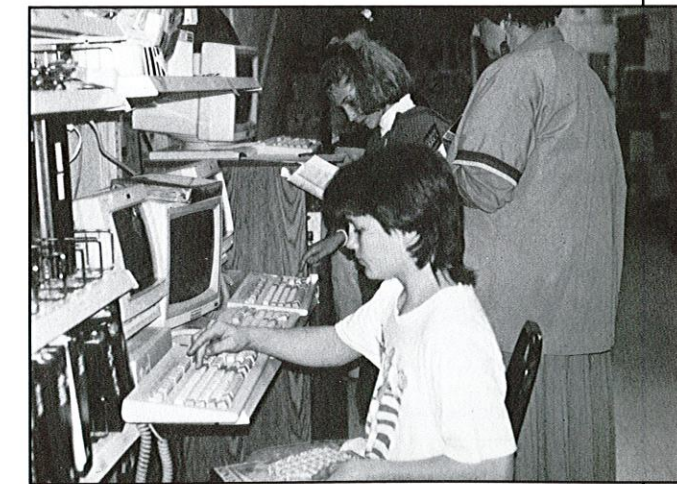

College Bound

The College Bound Program of the West Virginia Education Fund was created in 1987 with the following goals:

- Identifying and lessening financial, attitudinal and other barriers, real or perceived, that affect parents' and students' decisions about college;
- Functioning as a convener around this issue and as a clearinghouse and resource for educators, students, parents, community and business members; and
- Increasing and enhancing awareness about the changing economic base and promoting realistic avenues for students to prepare successfully for the future.

In 1987 approximately 32 percent of West Virginia's high school graduates were enrolling in college or other post-secondary training. The current rate is approximately 50 percent, confirmed by the larger freshmen enrollment currently experienced by most of the state's public and private colleges and universities.

The College Bound Program includes the following elements:

A Day on Campus

Since early 1988, "A Day on Campus" has provided the opportunity for 26,368 students in grades four through nine to visit college and university campuses in West Virginia. Although targeted to students, some of the 1,200 parents and other adult chaperones who have accompanied them have subsequently enrolled in college as a result of their visit! "A Day on Campus" is sponsored by Ashland Oil, Inc.

West Virginia College Sort

This innovative computer program, designed by Mr. Joe Lupia of Wheeling, provides detailed information about every college and university in West Virginia. The program, donated to the Education Fund and updated every two years by

Mr. Lupia, is distributed to high school principals and guidance counselors and to college admissions personnel. Available with a user's guide, the program facilitates comparisons of various institutions for students and their parents.

West Virginia Scholarship Directory

This annual publication provides information to students and their parents about more than 100 private sector scholarships that are available to West Virginia students. It is distributed to state high schools, colleges and universities and copies are available from the Education Fund upon request.

The West Virginia Business & Education Alliance was created as a separate unit of the Education Fund in response to the national Business Roundtable's (BRT) initiative to improve public education. The BRT is comprised of the chief executive officers of the nation's 200 largest companies. Their efforts in West Virginia are chaired by Mr. John Hall, chairman and CEO of Ashland Oil. The West Virginia Education Fund was selected to head this important initiative, and the Alliance was established to implement the program.

The BRT has identified nine essential components of a successful education system, which the Alliance has endorsed and will seek to implement in West Virginia. At the suggestion of West Virginia Governor Gaston Caperton, the first undertaking of this new unit of the Fund is to assist local school improvement councils throughout the state.

Local school improvement councils, which were part of West Virginia's education reform program of 1990, are designed to provide an opportunity for the major stakeholders in education at the local level to be involved in decision making affecting their schools. These councils have the power to make decisions affecting the school and even to propose waivers to state policy if they will benefit the students by improving the education in their schools. At least one member of every council is a representative of business or industry.

During the past year, the Alliance has recruited and trained 50 volunteer county coordinators, also from business and industry. The county coordinators assist the business representatives who serve on the school improvement councils in their respective counties, providing training and resources to energize councils throughout the state. In addition, county school liaisons have been enlisted to assist the volunteer county coordinators in their interaction with the education community.

The Alliance organized and sponsored an intensive two-day training symposium for volunteer coordinators in September 1992. Topics addressed included national and statewide education restructuring, children-focused priority setting, the business role in school improvement and the potential for West Virginia's local school improvement councils. Participants heard from business leaders, outstanding and innovative educators and the executive director of the Education Fund.

Among the resources the Alliance has made avail-

able to the county coordinators are a video promoting the importance and potential of school improvement councils and a publication about local school improvement councils for lay members.

Throughout West Virginia, the Alliance is assisting business representatives on school improvement councils in such efforts as:

- Group meetings to preview the new video and provide more information about the potential of the councils
- Working with county school administrations to recognize and work toward common goals
- Gathering significant data regarding the schools in their counties to identify issues which need to be addressed

The Alliance's goal is to assist the business representatives and others in making a difference for real, systematic change in West Virginia schools. In order to achieve a world-class educational system by the 21st century, West Virginia needs the concentrated effort of business and education working together — with the nation's and West Virginia's children as the ultimate beneficiaries. The school improvement council is a tremendous mechanism for achieving this goal.

Becoming a Nation of Readers

Read Aloud West Virginia is a new program of the West Virginia Education Fund, funded through a three-year grant from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation. Built on a successful volunteer program which began in 1986, Read Aloud is designed to involve the community in the classroom by providing trained volunteers to provide support to the classroom teacher.

This support of reading is especially important, considering:

Pre-school and elementary students are watching an average of 30 hours of television each week, and extensive studies show that the more TV viewed by children, the lower their grades; the less TV viewed, the higher their grades.

Studies also show:

- 60% of inmates in U.S. prisons are illiterate
- 80% of youth offenders have remedial reading problems
- Boys make up 70% of remedial reading classes in this country

Reading experts suggest we can become a nation of readers if:

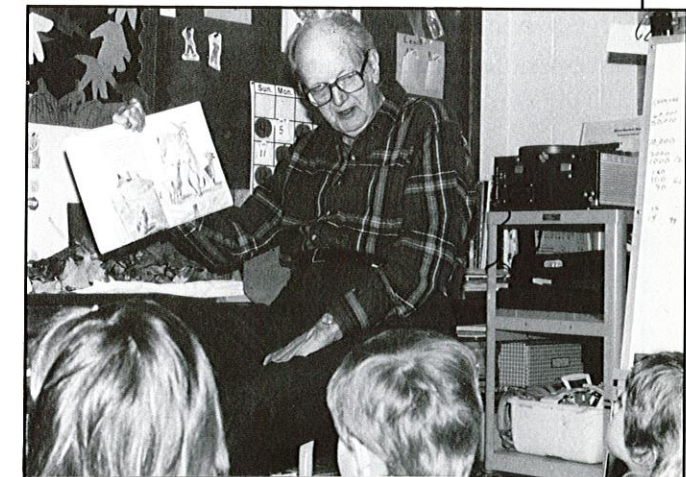
- We learn to control TV viewing in our homes
- Men, as well as women, become role models for children in showing their love of books and their enjoyment of reading
- We make books as exciting as a new toy or sports event

The mission of Read Aloud West Virginia is to develop lifetime readers, a key ingredient to success as an adult. The goal of the program is to establish Read Aloud in each county in West Virginia as another avenue to provide community support for schools.

Volunteers are recruited and trained to serve as readers in individual classrooms, school libraries, before school and in other public settings, working under the direction of the teacher or appropriate staff member. Recognized as an inter-generational program, Read Aloud volunteers include parents, retirees, business people, high school students and others.

Read Aloud West Virginia is acknowledged as a program that benefits all ages as it:

- Creates interest in books and fosters love of reading
- Increases attention span and vocabulary
- Strengthens a child's reading, writing and speaking skills
- Establishes "quality time" between adults and children
- Develops lifelong reading habits

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
JUNE 30, 1992

NOTE 1 — SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

GENERAL - The West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. (the Fund) was established in 1983 as a nonstock corporation under the laws of the State of West Virginia and is classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax-exempt organization under the provisions of Code Sec. 501(c)(3). The primary purpose of the West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. is to advance the quality of public education in West Virginia schools.

The programs of the Fund consist of Classroom Minigrants, Partnerships in Education, College Bound, Schools Ahead-21, Education Policy Research, West Virginia Business and Education Alliance, Read Aloud, and various other programs. The Classroom Minigrants program awards grants to deserving teachers to support their innovative projects for which funding would otherwise be unavailable. In the Partnerships in Education program, schools and businesses or other private sector organizations work together for a cooperative, mutually beneficial relationship. The College Bound program was established to encourage more high school graduates to attend college or other post secondary training. The Schools Ahead-21 Program recognizes schools that are doing an outstanding job of preparing students for success in the 21st century. The Education Policy Research Program is designed to explore core policy issues in public school education. West Virginia Business and Education Alliance is an effort, in conjunction with the National Business Roundtable, to improve public education. The Read Aloud Program teaches children the joy of reading. Funding for these programs is principally by gifts and grants from individuals, corporations, foundations, and others.

SHORT-TERM INVESTMENTS - Short-term investments are stated at cost, which approximates market, and consist primarily of federally-insured certificates of deposit with maturities ranging from 60 days to one year, and money market funds on deposit with a brokerage firm.

FURNISHINGS AND EQUIPMENT — Donated furnishings and equipment are not recorded by the Fund, due to the insignificance of dollar amount and the difficulty of determining value. Purchased furniture and equipment are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

GRANTS AND AWARDS — Grants and awards are recorded as expense in the period in which they are approved by the Board of Directors. Grants payable at year end consist of grants approved and awarded but not disbursed. Refunds of the unexpended portion of grants are netted against expense in the period the refunds are received.

EXPENDABLE RESTRICTED RESOURCES — Gifts or grants restricted by the donor, grantor, or other outside party for particular purposes are deemed to be earned and reported as revenues when expenditures in compliance with the specific restrictions have been incurred. Prior to meeting specified restrictions, such gift or grant revenue is deferred.

PLEDGES — Legally enforceable pledges are recorded as receivables in the year made. Pledges for support of current operations are recorded as revenue. Pledges for support of future operations are recorded as deferred revenue. If the donor does not specify which period is being supported, revenue is recognized when payments are scheduled to be received.

Pledges are received from foundations, businesses, and individuals who are located in or have an interest in the State of West Virginia. Substantially all of the total pledges receivable are due from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation.

FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES — The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statements of revenue and support, expenses and changes in fund balance. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

NOTE 2 — PENSION PLAN

The Fund has established a defined contribution pension plan for all full-time employees. Monthly contributions equal to 8% of an employee's monthly compensation are required under the Plan. Contributions are funded as accrued. Total expense was \$23,508 for 1992 and \$18,032 for 1991.

NOTE 3 — DEFERRED REVENUE

NOTE 4 — OPERATING LEASES

The fund leases its office space under an operating lease which expires on September 30, 1994. Minimum future rental payments under this lease total \$50,310 as follows: June 30, 1993 - \$ 21,660; June 30, 1994 - \$22,860; June 30, 1995 - \$5,790.
