In 1983, business, civic, and educational leaders in West Virginia created the West Virginia Education Fund.

Distinguished as the nation's first statewide education fund, the West Virginia Education Fund is a catalyst for private sector involvement in public school improvement. Its programs share a single focus: to enrich the opportunities available in public schools with private resources.

The Education Fund's Board of Directors includes business, industry, civic, professional, and educational leaders. While the Education Fund is independent of the West Virginia Department of

Education, the State Department of Education and County Boards of Education welcome and support the Fund and its efforts.

The effect of the Education Fund on the public schools in West Virginia has been significant.

The results are greater public involvement in schools, reduced isolation of the schools from their communities, enhanced learning experiences for children in school and valued, independent research.

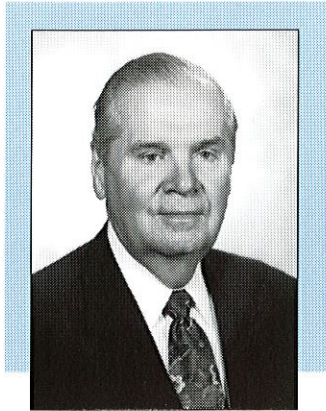
The Education Fund's efforts are financed through contributions from business and industry, individuals and foundations.

President's Message

A few years ago, only a handful of people viewed West Virginia as a leader in public school improvement. However, as our state prepares to enter the next century, West Virginia is now nationally recognized as a model due to the tremendous strides we have



made to better the system. The Education Fund takes considerable pride in being a part of this progress.

The Education Fund is uniquely positioned

among the various groups striving for further advancement in our state's public school system. Because we focus on benefits to students, the Fund is recognized as an independent and objective organization. The Fund has helped change the landscape of the public school system and our programs, services and research initiatives continue to build the needed trust and collaboration among the state's education and business leaders.

We are pleased to have contributed to the creation of Senate Bill 300: The Jobs Through Education Act. This landmark legislation incorporates many of the recommendations of two of the Education Fund's studies, ***Achieving Despite Adversity***, and ***Ready for What?*** The bill articulates a strategy for changing the way our students are taught, implementing more challenging instructional goals and objectives, and providing more direction to students on career preparation. This legislation is a tremendous way to help move our schools forward in meeting and exceeding the educational needs of students for success in the next century.

We have expanded the scope of the Education Fund so that we can better serve the needs of our constituency. WOW (Working On Wellness) has been incorporated into the Fund, and this initiative will facilitate wellness programs and activities in the state's schools to help eliminate poor health as a barrier to learning.

Our broad business connections developed over the years will be utilized through Tech Corps - West Virginia, another new unit of the Fund. The purpose of this initiative is to connect all classrooms to the Internet and organize technology-literate people from communities to provide technical support and training on how to incorporate new technologies into our public school system.

The Education Fund also has expanded its long-standing relationship with the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, which has been generous with its financial support for many years. Vivian Owens, the Fund's long-time executive director, is now on-loan to lead the new Benedum Center for Education Reform at West Virginia University. It is an honor for both her and the Fund that she be recruited to direct this project. We were pleased to appoint Emily Papadopoulos as acting executive director. She has responded with enthusiastic and competent leadership.

It has been a true privilege to serve as President of the Education Fund for the past two years. In this time, I have had the opportunity to work closely with a Board that has been involved and has provided outstanding direction for the Fund, a staff that provides the highest level of service to our constituents and volunteers who contribute greatly to the success of the Education Fund.

Director's Comments

If the charge to "Think globally, act locally," resonates with you, so will the activities of the West Virginia Education Fund for 1996. In this year of significant transition, the organization has matured into one with considerable influence in the education reform and policy making arenas, while maintaining its long-established investments in local school and community-level improvements. Several activities and changes have propelled the Fund into new spheres.

Staff activities this year have ranged from providing Read Aloud training to Shepherd College's Men's Basketball Team, to hosting a statewide conference for Local School Improvement Councils and assisting partners such as the West Virginia Department of Education and West Virginia's Office of School to Work with activities such as setting standards, selecting new statewide assessments, and conducting field research in the "career majors" established with the passage of Senate Bill 300. Similarly, the persistent work of the staff and advisory members in the Partnerships in Education Program have moved the Education Fund very close to becoming the first state in the nation to have secured business or community partners for each of its public schools.

A new connection between the Education Fund, West Virginia's public schools, and the world, has been established through Tech Corps - West Virginia. This effort to secure and provide technical assistance to schools connecting to the Internet has resulted in the Fund coming "on-line" and a plan to develop a homepage on WorldWide Web.

Educating the public on significant policy issues and promoting our research findings have been two significant areas for outreach by the Education Fund Board members and staff this year. Presentations on our studies have

been made to civic leaders, teachers, superintendents, parents, and at a variety of conferences.

The Fund is pleased to welcome Monica Twyman as its Working on Wellness Coordinator and

Dr. Linda Crone as a research specialist with the Fund's Education Policy Research Institute to its staff this year. And the departure of Vivian Owens for an on-loan position with



West Virginia University has established a connection between the Fund's work and teacher education.

With the generous support of the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, the Education Fund has been able to communicate with its "customers," learning program results, areas for improvement, and the most valued aspects of the Fund's work. Completed in August, the organizational evaluation points to the many successes but also provides insight into the need for more effective communication and program coordination. Implementing the recommendations outlined in the report will provide for continuing transition and improvement at the West Virginia Education Fund in 1997.

Introduction

The West Virginia Education Fund has six programs under its auspices - all of which involve the private sector working together with public education, community leaders, parents and policy makers to provide students with the academic, technical, social and problem-solving skills needed to be well prepared for life in a competitive and global society. Evidence corroborates the link between student achievement and committed communities, and it is gratifying to know that West Virginia and the nation are confirming the importance of the Education Fund's initiatives to encourage excellence in the state's public schools.

The Education Fund's programs foster learning and an understanding of issues that affect learning, and help today's students function at

the highest levels necessary to confront greater academic challenges and reach new academic heights.

The mission of the Education Fund is to advance the quality of public education in West Virginia by:

(1) promoting cooperation and communication between public schools and the private sector;

(2) recognizing and encouraging excellence and innovation in teaching and the learning process;

(3) providing students and teachers with a realistic picture of the world of work and better understanding of the preparation needed for employment; and

(4) providing research and analysis regarding critical education issues in West Virginia.

The organization has made a long-term commitment to advancing the quality of education in West Virginia. The Education Fund continues to utilize the resources of the private sector and select approaches where its contributions can provide the most benefit to the state's students and public school system.

Minigrants for Classroom Projects

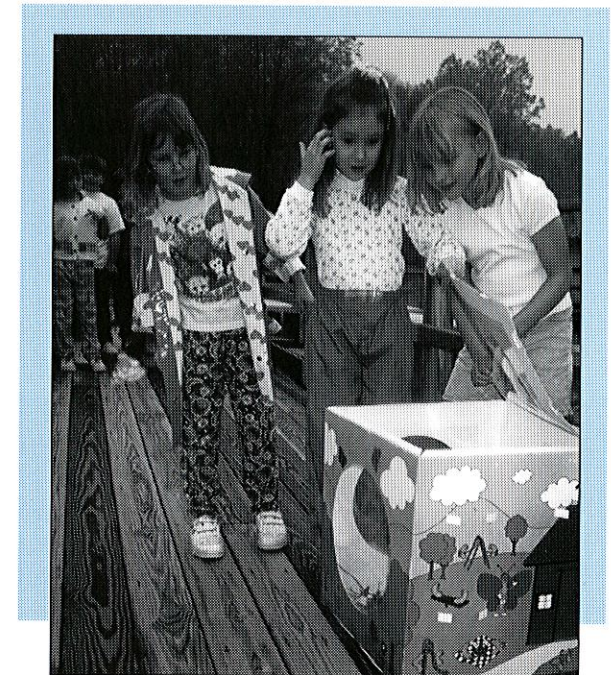
Minigrants for Classroom Projects are competitive grants of up to \$500 that are awarded by the Education Fund to teachers in support of innovative projects that make learning fun and stimulating for students, and for valuable approaches to learning for which no public funds are available.

The small grants afford teachers the opportunity to test their ideas about curriculum content and technique. Teachers design projects covering a broad range of subjects spanning primary through secondary curricula, and often involve parents, community members and other parts of the school population in addition to the targeted students.

Minigrants are awarded based on the academic and creative value of the proposals, and provide direct support to the most critical working relationship in education; the one between teacher and student. Through the grants, West Virginia teachers have enabled students to conduct geological digs and expeditions, run a radio station, write books, and experience entrepreneurial ventures such as a student-managed school store. The results of completed projects illustrate how small grants can make a big difference in the classroom.

The program also recognizes and rewards teachers for their dedication and commitment toward excellence in education, and attracts attention to the effective efforts of schools and teachers.

Minigrant winners are selected by volunteer review committees comprised of educators, business people and others who are representative of the communities in the particular regions. The committee members funded the projects listed beginning on page 26 of this report.

The Education Fund also offered Parental Involvement Awards, which are competitive grants to stimulate educators and community members to work together on school-based projects to encourage parents to become more involved in the education of their children. These grants, sponsored by the Union Carbide Foundation, Inc., may be up to \$1,000 each and often support projects that involve parents as co-learners with their children. Partnerships in Education

Partnerships in Education links schools and businesses or other community organizations in cooperative and mutually beneficial relationships. The program provides a means by which schools can benefit from the sharing of human resources and expertise from business, and does not focus on financial contributions to the schools. Ultimately, partnerships serve the interests of the students, schools, businesses and communities as a whole.

The objectives of the program are: (1) to bring business people into the schools to work with students, teachers and administrators on projects that educators think will be helpful and business people feel qualified to accomplish; (2) to give students and teachers a realistic picture of the business world and of the preparation students need for success; (3) to supplement classroom studies with relevant learning experiences in business and industry; and, (4) to give business people an understanding of the education system, how it works, its strengths and its problems.

Each partnership develops its unique set of cooperative activities. A partnership has a steering committee that evaluates school data, determines what will improve academic achievement and then builds activities to meet those needs. Among the opportunities for partnerships include curriculum development, student internships, tutoring arrangements, classroom speakers, student incentive programs, surplus equipment donations, teacher summer employment, enhancing student technology skills, and career exploration and preparation that help students acquire the necessary academic, social and workplace readiness skills needed for success.

The Partnerships in Education Advisory Committee, chaired by Michael Albert, made significant strides in 1996 to link remaining schools with businesses. With more than 815

public schools (96 percent) participating in the program, West Virginia has one of the largest initiatives of its kind in the country and should become the first state to have all public schools engaged with business partners.

The Education Fund continues to recognize the exemplary efforts of the state's partnerships through Partnerships in Education Awards. Winners in 1995-96 were: Birch River Elementary and Blue Ribbon Sport and Trophy Shop (Nicholas County); Liberty Elementary and Monongahela Power Company (Hancock County); Madison Elementary and West Liberty State College (Ohio County); Wheeling Middle and Wheeling Power Company and Coeey-Bentz Furniture Company (Ohio County); Wirt County High and Westvaco Corp. (Wirt County); and, Fairmont Senior High and Monongahela Power Company (Marion County).

College Bound

The College Bound Program is intended to encourage more of West Virginia's high school graduates to continue their education at the college or post-secondary level. The program facilitates the idea that attending college is an option for all students in West Virginia.

The goals of the program, which began in 1987, are: (1) identifying and lessening financial, attitudinal and other barriers, real or perceived, that affect parents' and students' decisions about college; (2) functioning as a convener around this issue and as a clearinghouse and resource for educators, students, parents, and community and business members; and (3) increasing and enhancing awareness about the changing economic base and promoting realistic avenues for students to prepare successfully for the future.

A Day On Campus

This component enables students in grades four through nine to visit a college or university in West Virginia for a meaningful experience with college life. The program has enabled more than 44,000 students and thousands of parent chaperones to make the visits since 1988. The Education Fund, through the sponsorship of Ashland Inc., pays up to one-half the cost of the trip up to \$100 per school each year.

The trips provide inspiration for a number of students, many of whom are subsequently convinced that attending college is feasible and realize that to do so requires planning and the attainment of strong academic skills. Teachers also report that the visits provide opportunities for students to see options other than local jobs, and for the first time cause students to consider what they want to accomplish with their lives.

A directory describing the appropriate procedures for arranging visits is sent each year

to all West Virginia schools with students in grades four through nine.

Scholarship Directory

A Scholarship Directory, a component of the program for the past seven years, is intended to encourage more of West Virginia's high school graduates to take advantage of financial aid available to continue their education at a college or university. Designed to help remove some of the financial barriers that may keep students from attending college, the publication presents information about scholarships that are available from companies and organizations that conduct business or are located in West Virginia. Additionally, the directory contains information regarding the entire financial aid process, the forms involved and the different types of grants and loans that are available.

WV Business and Education Alliance

The West Virginia Business and Education Alliance was founded in 1991 as a unit of the Education Fund and an affiliate of the National Business Roundtable (BRT). The BRT has endorsed nine essential components of a successful education system that the Alliance seeks to implement in West Virginia.

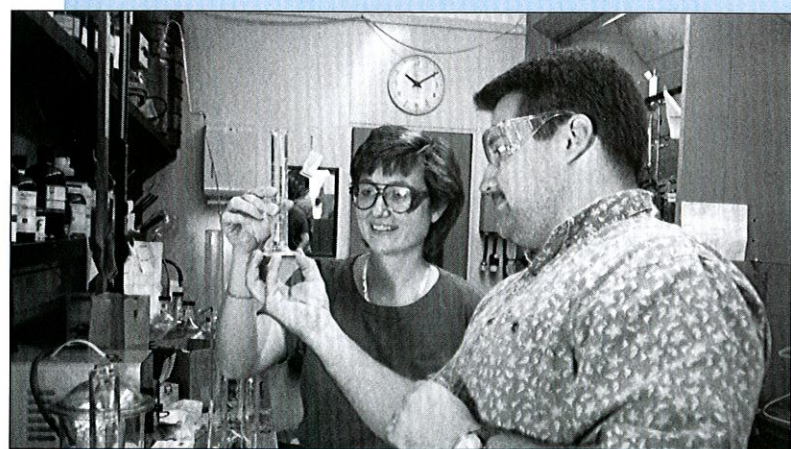
The Alliance has focused its efforts particularly on the implementation of rigorous academic standards which are measured by reliable tests and assessments. In addition, the Alliance has recognized the potential of Local School Improvement Councils (LSICs) to improve schools and has worked to make LSICs as effective as possible. This year, the Alliance sponsored a successful statewide conference that was attended by more than 300 members of LSICs from across the state.

The Alliance recognized nine exemplary LSICs with Progress Awards. The winners' actions include increasing community involvement in the school, improving test scores, addressing health needs of students and the community, implementing new school discipline policies, and proposing alternatives to local and state board of education policies through the waiver process.

Councils receiving awards of \$1,000 each in recognition of their work and accomplishments were: Chandler Elementary (Kanawha County); Hacker Valley Elementary (Webster County); Hodgesville Elementary (Upshur County); Hurricane High (Putnam County); Ivydale Elementary (Clay County); Kimball Elementary (McDowell County); Madison Elementary (Ohio County); Stollings Elementary (Logan County); and Waitman Barbe Elementary (Monongalia County).

In the area of standards, the Alliance built upon its October 1995 release of the report, ***Ready for What? What Business Expects, What Higher Education Requires, What Students Need*** by conducting four "employer panels" that explored four career majors as established by Senate Bill 300: The Jobs Through Education Act. The Act directs schools to focus more of their efforts on career preparation for students and to work with businesses to help students develop many of the skills identified in ***Ready for What?***

The Alliance is co-chaired by John R. Hall, Chairman of Ashland Inc., and Dr. E. Linn Draper, Chairman and CEO of American Electric Power Company. The Alliance's work is coordinated by an executive committee made up of representatives from these additional corporations: Ashland Coal, Inc., Banc One West Virginia Corporation, Bell Atlantic - West Virginia, CSX Transportation, E.I. DuPont de Nemours Co., Inc., Kmart Corporation, Union Carbide Corporation, and United Parcel Service.

Read Aloud West Virginia

Read Aloud West Virginia is a broad-based volunteer effort that seeks to motivate children to want to read. Recognizing that all human beings are motivated to do those activities they find enjoyable, Read Aloud's primary purpose is to provide a "commercial" for reading that introduces children to the pleasure reading can provide.

A program of the Education Fund since 1992 and funded to date by the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, Read Aloud has sought to establish individual county programs in each of the state's 55 counties. Read Aloud offers participating counties a variety of enrichment programs from which to choose.

The largest component of the program, Readers in Schools, involves trained volunteers who visit classrooms regularly to share good books and their love of reading with students. These readers offer students a powerful live commercial for reading which results in greater student interest in books and reading. More than 5,000 volunteers have been trained and are reading to approximately 65,000 children in 52 counties.

The "Students Reading To Students" segment of the program is growing rapidly, as each year more public school students and college students are reading aloud to younger students. Among the benefits of such student interaction are increased self-esteem and exposure to volunteerism for the older students, and the realization for the younger students that reading is important for all ages.

Book trunks have been provided to county organizations to ensure that volunteer readers have access to a diversified selection of quality and age-appropriate books. The traveling trunks have been delivered to a number of counties, including many in which the distance to the nearest public library may be considerable for volunteers.

The program, for the third consecutive year, conducted a statewide conference that convened volunteers, teachers, parents, librarians and others to share successes and learn about additional ways that Read Aloud could benefit their counties. Attracting more than 400 participants, the conference focused on book selections for read aloud sessions, and included workshops with nationally recognized authors.

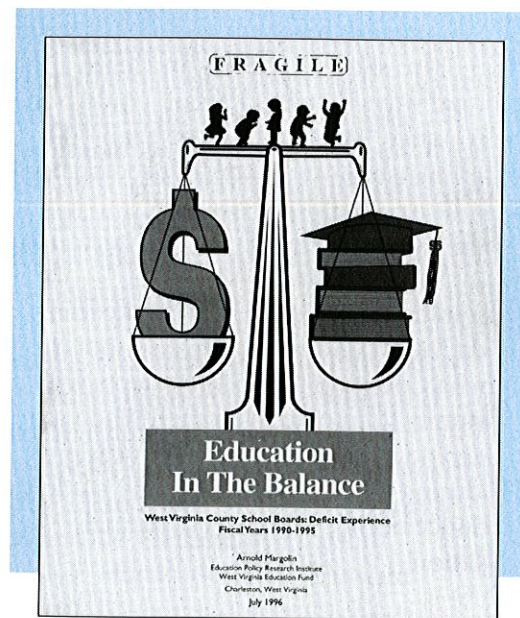
A new initiative, "Men's Summer Reading Brigade," was conducted at two schools in Kanawha County to provide students with an opportunity to interact with men who value reading and to combat the loss of academic skills during the summer that many students experience because of a lack of mental stimulation.

In early 1997, county read aloud organizations will be provided with a Read Aloud Resource Kit. Funded by a grant from the Ronald McDonald Children's Charities, the kit will provide organizations with ideas for successful initiatives and specific materials for developing and expanding programs.

Education Policy Research Institute

The Education Policy Research Institute, a program of the Education Fund since 1991, provides objective, timely and scholarly research on various policy issues affecting West Virginia's public school system. Its work is intended to provide information for state and county level policymakers to make informed decisions and strategic changes for the state's schools and students.

The mission of the Institute, which is funded through a grant from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, is: (1) conduct research and analysis on policy issues in public school education and related fields; (2) educate the public about important public school education policy issues facing West Virginia; and (3) encourage the use of the Institute's research to affect the content or outcome of public policy in West Virginia regarding public school education.



The Education Policy Research Institute report, **Fragile: Education in the Balance**, indicates that West Virginia's county school boards are finding it more difficult to balance their budgets and maintain the quality of educational programs and services necessary to prepare students.

This year the Institute released another study, **Fragile: Education in the Balance**, which examined the state's county school boards' financial performance from 1990-95. The specific objectives of the research were to identify those factors which affected the overall financial condition and financial soundness of the school boards. The report also sought to provide insight in determining why the number of school districts experiencing end-of-the-year deficits has been increasing.

The Institute also provided a research paper, *Statewide Uniform Excess Levy of Ad Valorem Taxes*, prepared at the request of the West Virginia Legislature that was considering a proposal to adopt a uniform statewide excess levy.

In addition to presentations to the Legislature, the Institute staff was invited to discuss its research with chambers of commerce, community groups, county school board associations, and county superintendents of schools.

The Institute is currently involved with a research paper examining the relationship between per pupil expenditures and Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills. The report will be released in early 1997. Additionally, the staff intends in the upcoming year to embark on a more aggressive and expanded agenda of issues, and will be able to do so with the addition of its new research specialist.

Development

West Virginia's businesses, foundations, organizations and individuals are playing an increasingly greater role in providing private support for our public schools through contributions to the Education Fund.

The Development Committee of the Education Fund provides the vision and leadership necessary to meet the organization's mission. Chaired by C.R. "Bud" Hill, Jr., the committee uses a mix of locally-driven annual giving campaigns throughout the state and special events to raise the unrestricted dollars necessary to supplement major grants from foundations for specific programs. By working closely with the Fund's Board of Directors, the committee identifies and secures individuals who lead the campaigns in their respective local communities.

Opportunities for Giving...

The Education Fund seeks and accepts contributions in a variety of ways. Gifts to the organization's Annual Fund can be allocated by the Board of Directors for the areas of greatest need. This flexibility allows the Education Fund to add to existing programs or take advantage of opportunities that may arise. Contributions may be in the form of cash or securities. A gift of stocks or bonds often has advantages to both the donor and to the Education Fund. In-kind gifts provide another welcomed opportunity for donors to support the course for advancing the quality of public education in West Virginia. The Education Fund also seeks restricted gifts from foundations, individuals and other sources for specific programs.

The Education Fund is a tax exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code and incorporated under West Virginia law as a not-for-profit corporation. Contributions are deductible for income and estate tax purposes to the extent permissible under the law.

Special thanks is given to the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation for providing long-term financial support, technical assistance, friendship and inspiration to the Education Fund.

Financial Report



INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

The Board of Directors
West Virginia Education Fund, Inc.

We have audited the balance sheet of West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. as of June 30, 1996 and 1995, and the related statements of changes in net assets, and cash flows for the years then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Fund's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audits in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audits provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As discussed in Note 1, the Fund changed its methods of accounting for contributions and certain investments, and its method of financial reporting and financial statement presentation.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. at June 30, 1996 and 1995, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the years then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

NOTE 1 -- SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

GENERAL - The West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. (the Fund) was established in 1983 as a nonstock corporation under the laws of the State of West Virginia. The primary purpose of the West Virginia Education Fund, Inc. is to advance the quality of public education in West Virginia schools.

The programs of the Fund consist of Classroom Minigrants, Partnerships in Education, Read Aloud, WV Business and Education Alliance, Education Policy Research, and various other programs. The Classroom Minigrants program awards grants to deserving teachers to support their innovative projects for which funding would otherwise be unavailable. In the Partnerships in Education program, schools and businesses and other private sector organizations work together for a cooperative, mutually beneficial relationship. The Education Policy Research program is designed to explore core policy issues in public school education. West Virginia Business and Education Alliance is an effort, in conjunction with the National Business Roundtable, to improve public education. The Read Aloud program teaches children the joy of reading. Funding for these programs is principally by gifts and grants from individuals, corporations, foundations, and others, with approximately 40 percent received from the Benedum Foundation.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Effective July 1, 1995, the Fund has adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) Number 116, "Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made," SFAS Number 117, "Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations," and SFAS Number 124, "Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations." This has resulted in certain changes in accounting and financial statement display. Amounts for the year ended December 31, 1995, have been restated to reflect retroactive application of these standards. The net effect on net assets at December 31, 1995, is an increase of \$555,996. The most significant changes are as follows:

- * Activity was previously reported in an unrestricted fund and a restricted fund. Activity is now reported based on whether the resources received are classified as unrestricted or temporarily restricted.
- * The term "fund balance," has been replaced with the term "net assets." Net assets are unrestricted or temporarily restricted.
- * Investments were previously reported at cost. Investments now are reported at market values. The net appreciation (depreciation) in investments are reported as investment gains (losses) in the Statement of Activities.

UNRESTRICTED NET ASSETS - Unrestricted net assets are those funds presently available for use by the Fund at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS - The temporarily restricted class is comprised of funds which are presently available for use by expendable only for purposes specified by the donor.

USE OF ESTIMATES - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ in those estimates.

INCOME TAX STATUS - The Fund is classified by the Internal Revenue Service as a nonprofit organization under the provisions of Code Sec. 501(c)(3), and is exempt from income taxes on income derived from its nonprofit activities. In addition, the Fund is classified as an organization other than a private foundation.

CASH AND SHORT-TERM INVESTMENTS - Substantially all cash is deposited in an interest bearing account with a large West Virginia bank. The amount in this account often substantially exceeds the federally insured maximum of \$100,000. Management believes the bank is financially sound and there is little credit risk associated with the deposits. Short-term investments are stated at market value, and consist primarily of U.S. Treasury Notes with maturities ranging from 1996 through 2001. All short-term investments are held at one national brokerage firm.

FURNISHINGS AND EQUIPMENT - Donated furnishings and equipment are not recorded by the Fund, due to the insignificance of the dollar amount and the difficulty of determining value. Purchased furniture and equipment over \$500 are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets, which range from three to five years.

GRANTS AND AWARDS EXPENSE - Grants and awards are recorded as an expense in the period in which they are approved by the Board of Directors. Grants payable at year end consist of grants approved and awarded but not disbursed. Refunds of the unexpended portion of grants are netted against expense in the period the refunds are received.

EXPENDABLE RESTRICTED RESOURCES - Gifts or grants restricted by the donor, grantor, or other outside party for particular purposes are deemed to be earned and reported as revenues when expenditures in compliance with specific restrictions have been incurred. Prior to meeting specified restrictions, such as gift or grant revenue is reported as part of temporarily restricted net assets.

GIFTS AND GRANTS, AND PLEDGES RECEIVABLE - Legally enforceable pledges are recorded as receivables in the year made. Pledges for support of current operations are recorded as revenue. If the donor does not specify which period is being supported, revenue is recognized when payments are scheduled to be received. Pledges are received from foundations, businesses, and individuals who are located in or have an interest in the State of West Virginia.

FUNCTIONAL ALLOCATION OF EXPENSES - The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of changes in net assets. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS - For purposes of reporting cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are defined as cash deposits.

NOTE 2 -- TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

NOTE 3 -- PENSION PLAN

The Fund has a defined contribution pension plan for all full-time employees. Monthly contributions equal to 8 percent of an employee's monthly compensation are required under the plan. Contributions are funded as accrued. Total expense was \$18,951 for 1996 and \$19,832 for 1995.

NOTE 4 -- OPERATING LEASES

The Fund leases its office space under an operating lease which expires on April 30, 2000. Total rent expense for the years ended June 30, 1996 and 1995 was \$39,958 and \$32,209, respectively. Minimum future rental payments under this lease are as follows: 1997- \$40,971; 1998 - \$41,822; 1999 - \$42,065; and 2000 - \$32,096.

NOTE 5 -- GRANTS AWARDED BUT NOT YET RECEIVED

The Fund was awarded a grant from the Benedum Foundation for Education Policy Research in the amount of \$387,336. Of this amount, \$207,336 had not been received as of June 30, 1996. In addition, grants from Benedum for the Local School Health Initiative and from the West Virginia Humanities Council for Minigrants in the amounts of \$25,000 and \$15,000 were awarded. Of these amounts, \$10,000 and \$7,500, respectively, had not been received as of June 30, 1996. In accordance with SFAS 116, "Accounting for Contributions Received and

Contributions Made," these grants are conditional promise to give; therefore, additions to net assets are not recorded until all conditions have been met or cash has been received.

NOTE 6 -- LONG-TERM DEBT

Long-term debt consists of a note payable to a bank in monthly installments of \$364 including interest at 7.25 percent, and is secured by a vehicle with a net book value of approximately \$5,300.

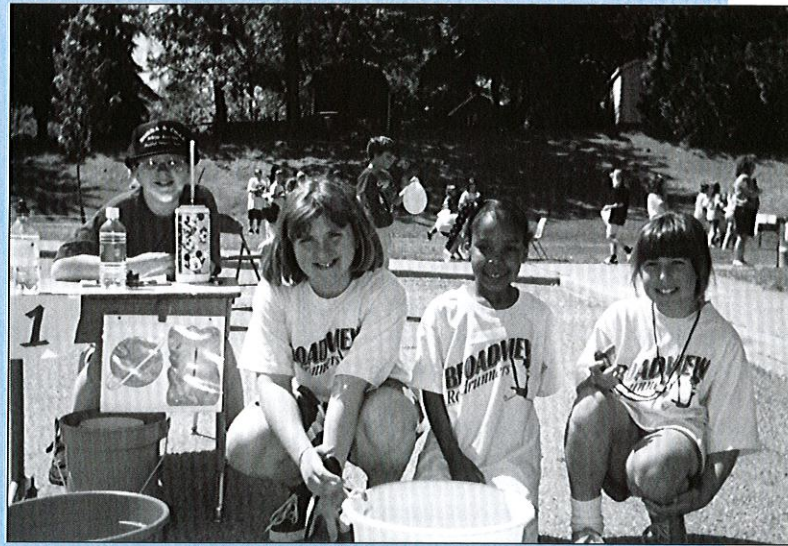

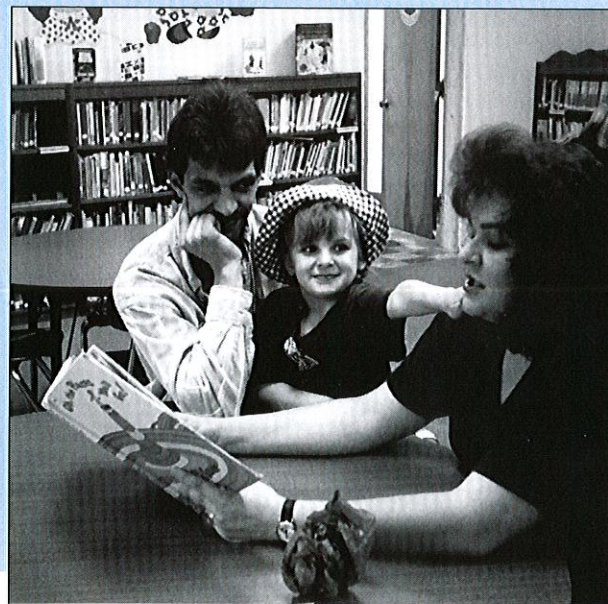
