## New \$4.7M Grant Will Help Education Alliance, Partners Support Workforce Development in Mississippi and West Virginia

CHARLESTON, W.Va, June 29, 2023 — Today, <u>Education Alliance</u> was awarded \$4.7 million from the <u>Appalachian Regional Commission</u> (ARC) for its new project **CAREERS (Career Acceleration Readiness and Employment Experiences for Region Students).** The funding was made available through ARC's <u>Appalachian Regional Initiative for Stronger Economies (ARISE)</u> which drives large-scale economic transformation through multi-state collaboration.

Education Alliance, along with 10 local partners in Mississippi and West Virginia, will help fill workforce needs in manufacturing and healthcare sectors by accelerating career education and training for underserved high school students seeking careers in these fields.

"I strongly believe that the key to transforming Appalachia's economic vitality can be found in vision and collaboration across state lines," said ARC Federal Co-Chair Gayle Manchin. "I'm encouraged by the way our newest ARISE grantees have come together to forge plans that will greatly increase workforce development and business ventures in ways that will positively affect the entire region."
